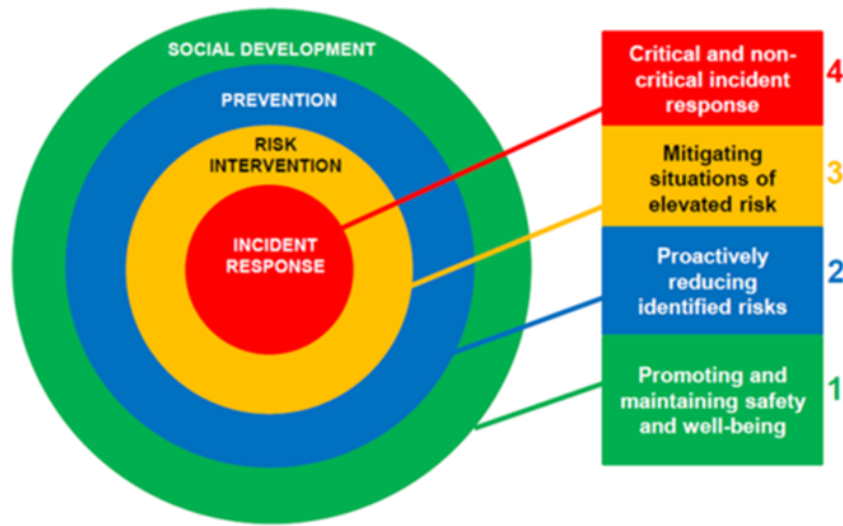

Brampton's first-ever Community Safety Action Plan

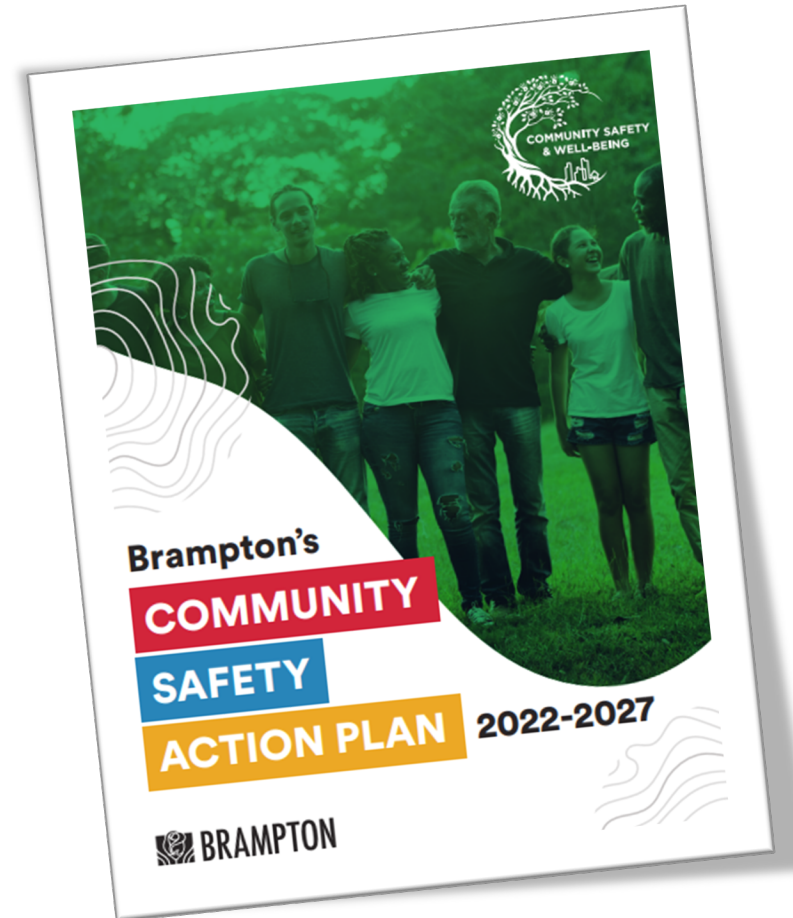
- Developed 25 actions under 3 priorities: **Safety** | **Awareness** | **Empowerment**

- Received input and feedback from **2800+ completed resident surveys** and **mapping tool comments**

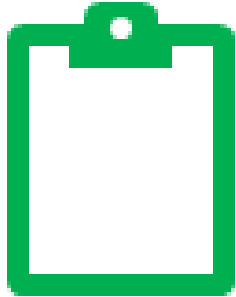

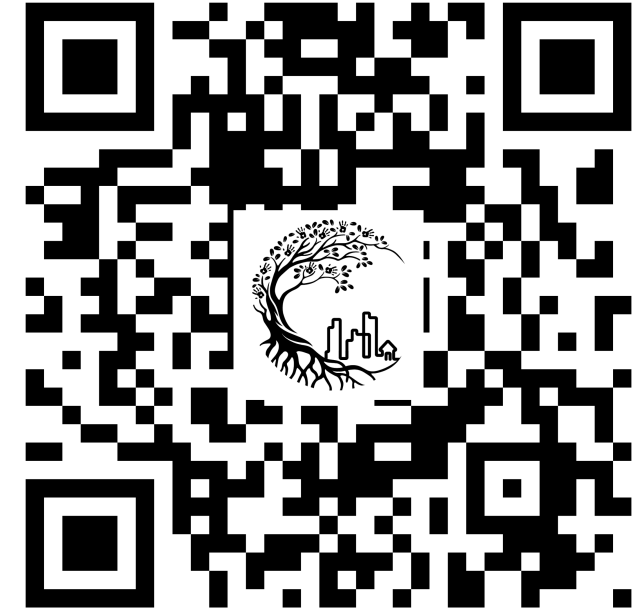

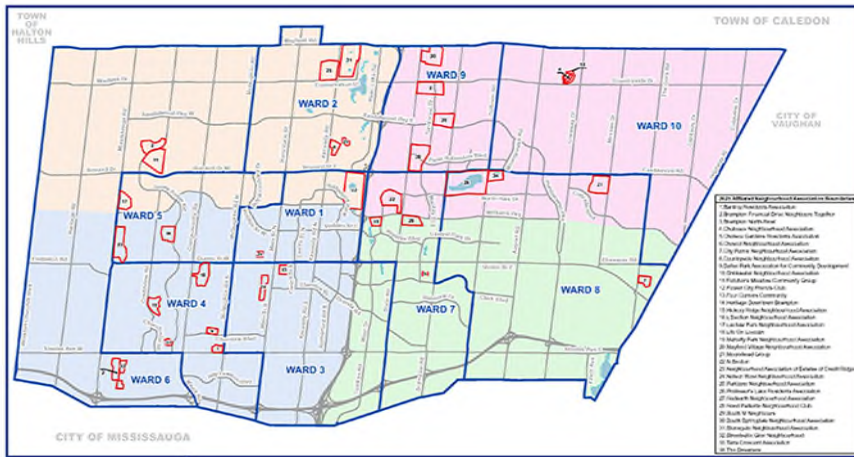
Outcomes:



- Residents gain access to municipal staff through CSWO
- Residents can take the lead in shaping the safety and well-being of their neighbourhoods
- Residents have increased opportunities to participate and connect within the community

2025 Affiliated Neighbourhood Associations

- 34 Affiliated Neighbourhood Associations received more than \$61k in Nurtured Neighbourhood Grant funding (first intake)
 - Up to \$2,000 for returning group and up to \$1,500 for new groups
- Projects: movie nights, litter cleanups, barbeques, street parties, fitness events, etc.
- Two intake periods - March 2025 and June 2025

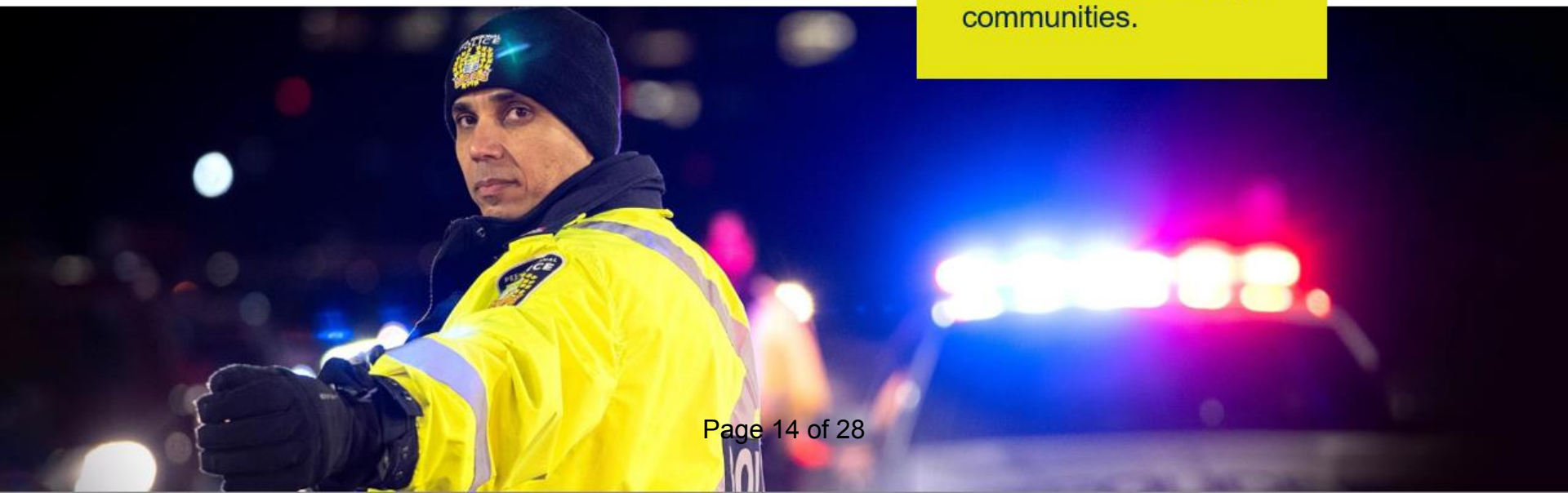

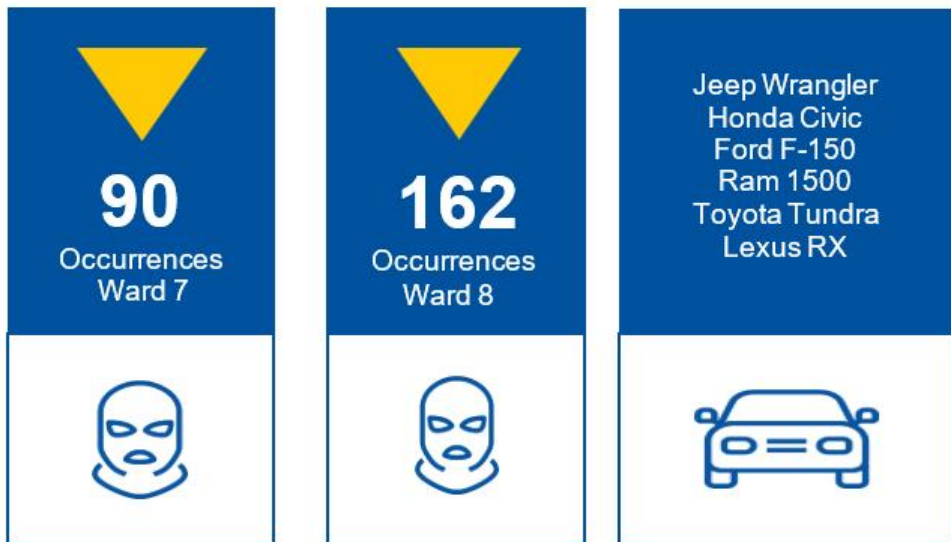
