5.1 Delegation by Jillian McLeod, Family Advocate, Justice 4 Families (Road Safety Advocacy Group), re: Road Safety Matters Pertaining to the City of Brampton, in Relation to a Petition Being Presented to the House of Commons

Jillian McLeod, Family Advocate, Justice 4 Families (Road Safety Advocacy Group), noted that she has created an online petition calling for stricter laws and harsher penalties for impaired and dangerous driving offences. The petition has over 100,000 signatures and will be presented to the House of Commons in February 2021. Ms. McLeod noted the importance of funding and strategic policies in creating a province-wide approach to decreasing the number of driving offences, and stated that she is in need of access to local-level research and data to support her petition.

A motion was introduced to receive Ms. McLeod's delegation and that she be invited to attend the Committee of Council meeting on January 20, 2021, to delegate to Committee and present her petition for Council consideration.

Committee discussion included the creation of a road safety subcommittee or committee of council.

The following motion was introduced:

"That a new sub-committee, within the existing sub-committee framework, be established regarding Road Safety matters, comprised of interested members of the Community Safety Advisory Committee, and an invitation be extended to Sargent. Inspector Peter Danos, Peel Regional Police, provided a presentation on the Community Safety and Well-Being model that included the following:

- Framework and focus areas
 - Incident response
 - social development
 - risk intervention
 - prevention
- Mobilization/Community Policing Operations
 - connections throughout the organization
 - integration with operations
 - coordinated activities, e.g. crisis response and local schools
 - CSWB (Community Safety and Well-being) activities, and situation tables
- 2018-2020 (YTD) statistics on fatalities and life-altering injuries
- Take the Pledge Peel (TTPP)
 - social development strategy to connect all community leaders, acting as an umbrella for annual safe driving campaigns
- Dangerous Driving Team
 - proactively address dangerous drivers (i.e. repeat offenders, street racers, stunt drivers, impaired drivers)

 - accused parties referred to Peel Addiction Referral Centre at time of arrest
- Road Safety Liaison Officer to provide assistance through partnering agencies

Background

- Road accidents taking human lives every day due to lack of infrastructure, and appropriate road signs, imbalance of employment and housing. Commercial buildings on major intersections are blocking the view of drivers

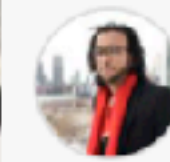
Jotvinder Sodhi of the Homeowners Welfare Association and Concerned Residents of Brampton said public concern has been elevated since the horrific death of elementary teacher Karolina Ciasullo and her three young daughters on June 8.

Sodhi raised the residents concerns about armed carjackings, deadly collisions, speeding and stunt driving to the Peel police services board on Sept. 25.

"The numbers of fatalities are high, and we're concerned about that," Sodhi told the Star. "We need to attack this from all angles including education and enforcement."

"Youth engagement is a problem too," Sodhi said. "Our youth are getting drawn to stunt driving and street racing."

Jotvinder Sodhi and other members of the Homeowners Welfare Association and Concerned Residents of Brampton raised concerns about armed carjackings, deadly collisions, speeding and stunt driving in a deputation to the Peel board.

"People are being killed and injured every day on our roads," Sodhi told the Star Monday. "This is a problem for the entire GTA."


Sodhi said public concern has been elevated since the horrific death of elementary teacher Karolina Ciasullo and her three young daughters.

"We need better response and police presence on the roads," Sodhi said. "Youth engagement is also something that we have to work on."

Brady Robertson, 20, of Caledon, has since been charged with four counts of dangerous driving causing death and impaired driving causing death in connection with the collision that killed Ciasullo.

Brampton Mayor Patrick Brown said Sodhi raised some legitimate concerns, adding that whether it's street racing or brazen car thefts, "we have to stem that."

Crime and public safety top of mind in Brampton Centre with federal election looming

A series of homicides and violent crimes leading up to the federal election has brought public safety back to the campaign forefront for residents in Brampton Centre.

In addition to a spike in shootings, break and enters and car thefts in recent years, the riding has seen a pair of high-profile homicides in the month leading up to the 2019 campaign writ drop, and Concerned Residents of Brampton executive team member [Jotvinder Sodhi](#) says residents are scared.

The [first incident occurred on Aug. 16](#) after a father killed his wife and son before taking his own life by jumping off the Williams Parkway overpass on Highway 410. The [second incident occurred exactly one month later](#) on Sept. 16 and involved two victims, one of them a teen. They were Peel Region's 18th and 19th homicides of 2019.

Concerned Residents of Brampton held a town hall at Terry Miller Recreation Centre last month. The meeting was attended by approximately 200 residents and focused primarily on public safety.


"People have raised a flag that they are scared and concerned," said Sodhi. "Irrespective of their political, social and religious differences, the same blood runs through everyone and we all have the same concerns."

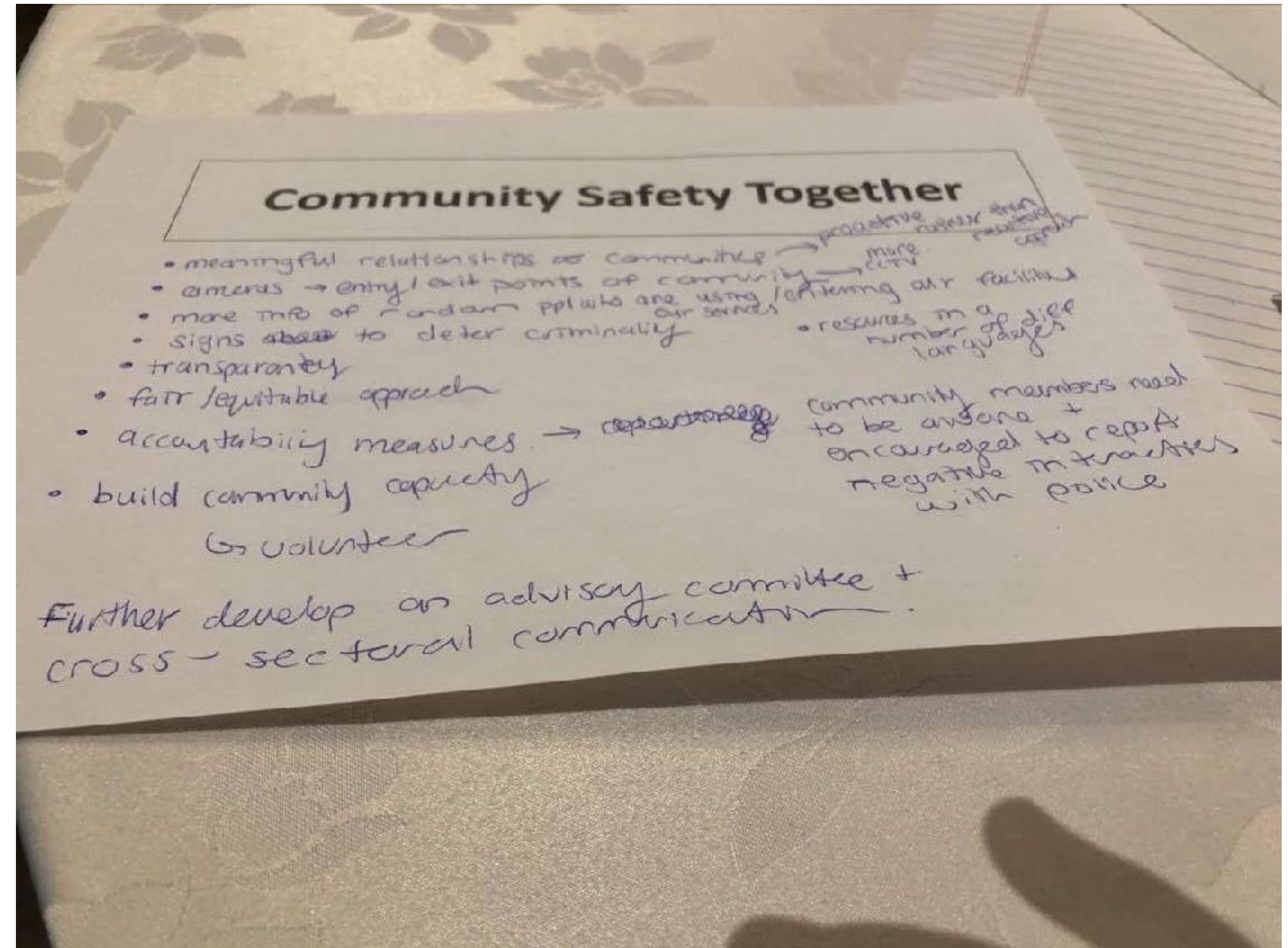


A group of community activists will host a town hall meeting to discuss issues of public safety and affordable housing in the city.

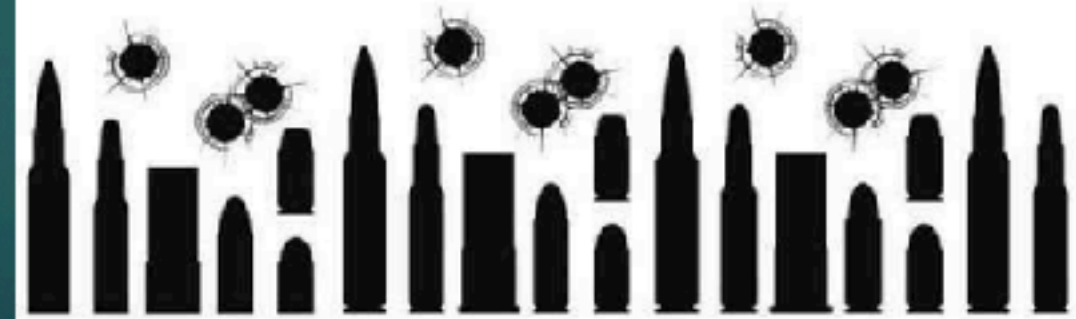

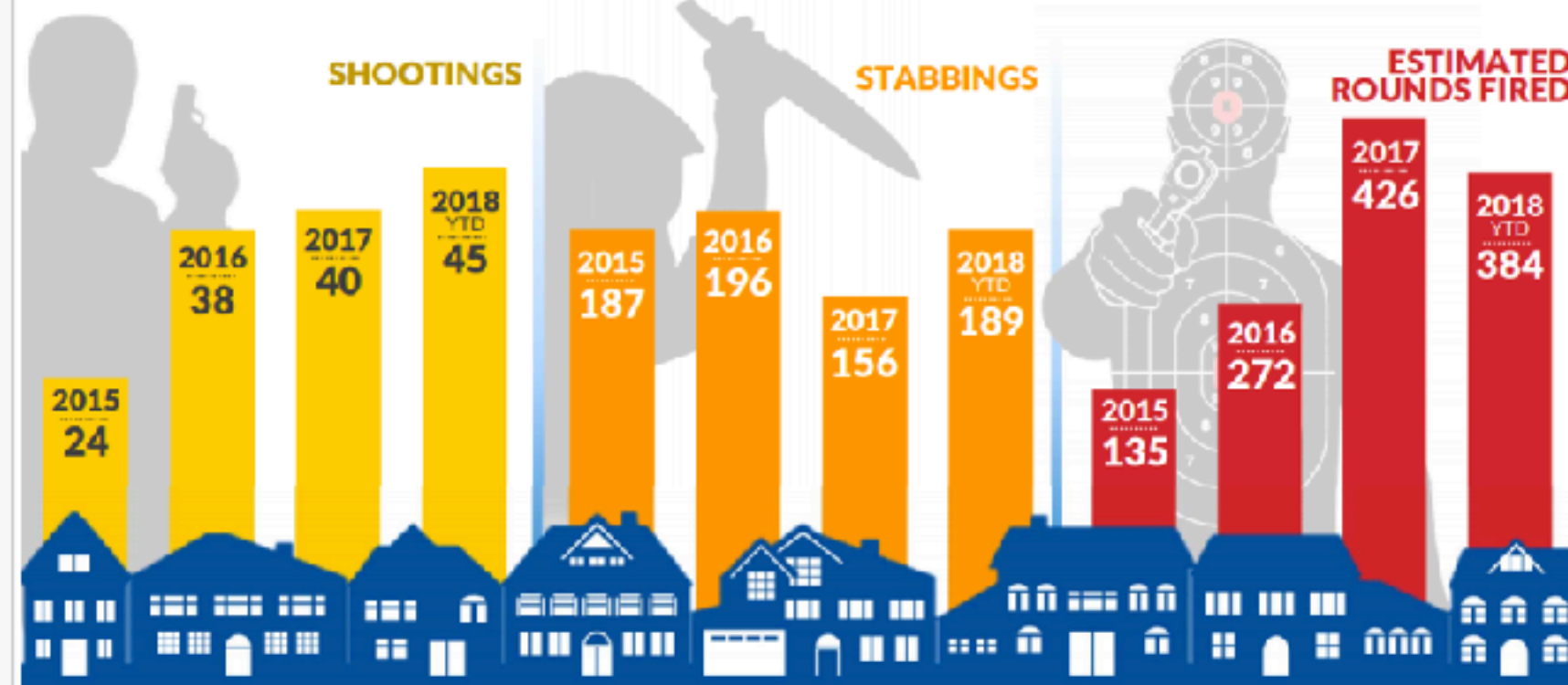

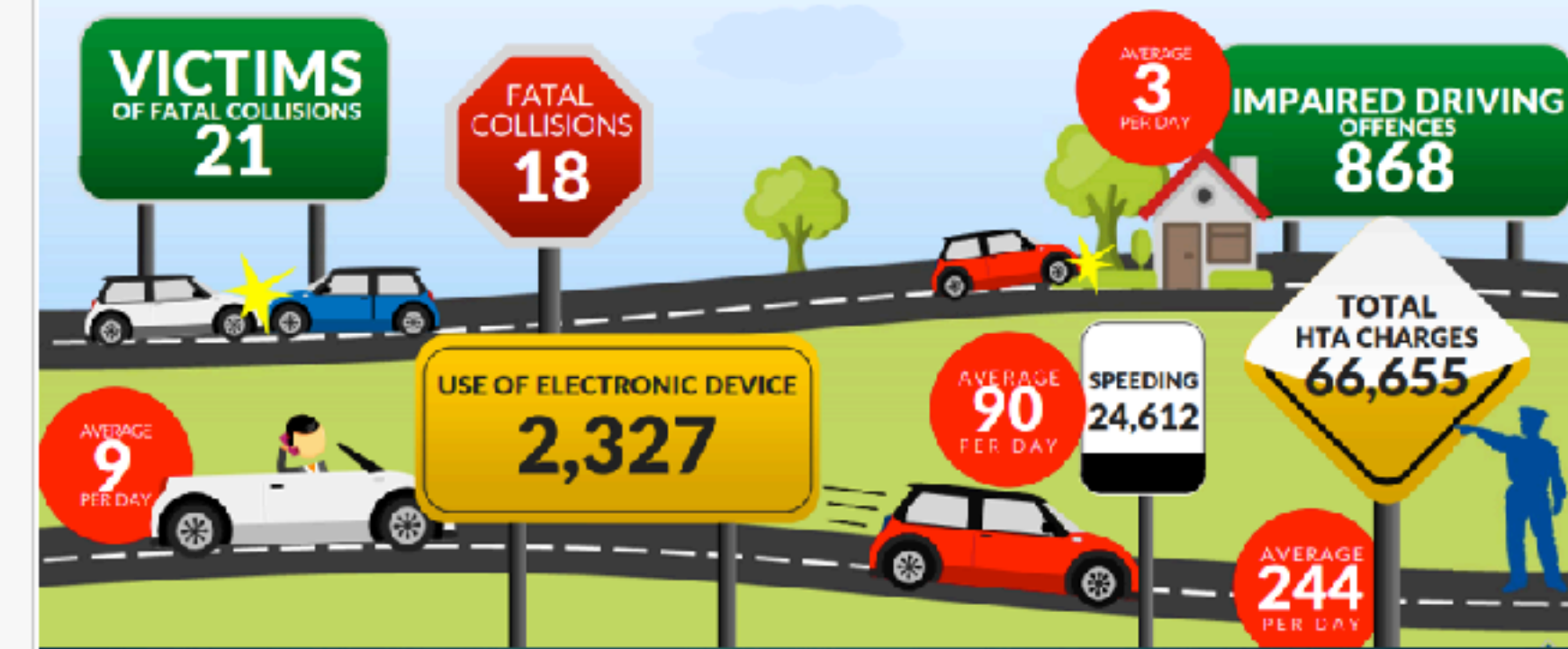

2. Ejaz Choudry, who was suffering from Schizophrenia was shot dead by the police.

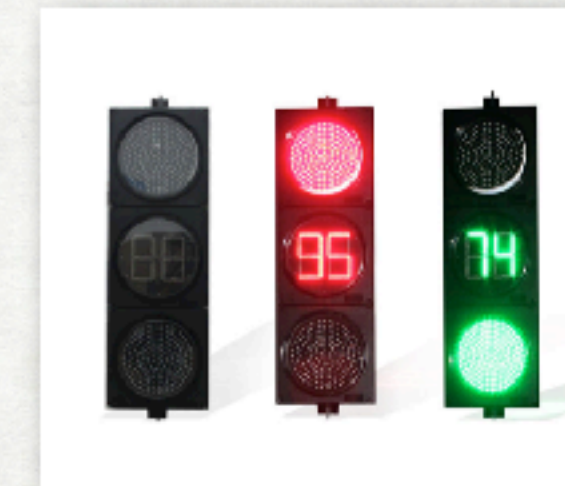
- The situation was not handled well which resulted in the loss of human life.

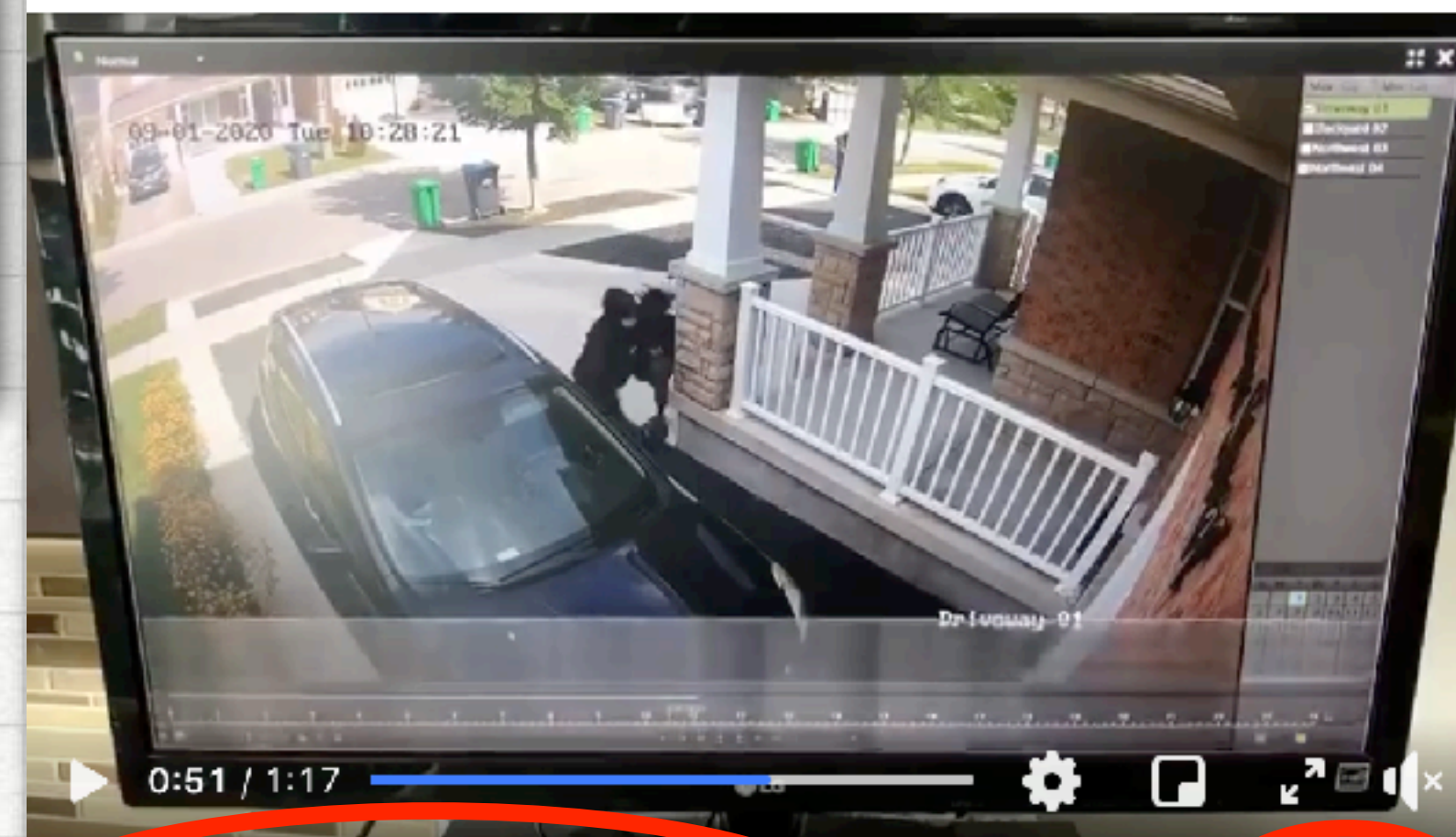

- July 24th Brampton- Five men have been arrested in relation to an assault involving sticks and cricket bats
- July 27th 4 People injured after being shot outside a Brampton home near Julian/Fitzpatrick Dr.
- July 28th A woman is dead and a man is injured after a shooting inside Brampton home in the Deerpark Cres and Fairglen Avenue area
- July 31st – Peel Police investigating after body found in a burned-out green space following outdoor fire between 2 homes in Brampton
- August 4th- Two men sent to hospital after a double stabbing in an apartment on Lisa St. in Brampton.
- August 6th- Brampton gas station robbed at gunpoint in the area of Mayfield & Airport Rd.
- August 13th- 26-year-old motorcyclist dead after colliding with a transport truck at Rutherford Rd/Glidden
- August 13th- A man is dead after being found with obvious signs of trauma in a Brampton park near Queen Mary Dr. and Whispering Hills Gate
- August 13th- A woman has died after being found in a garage
- August 14th – A 16-year-old boy has been charged with second degree murder in the death of a 22-year-old man, who was found bloody on Brampton park pathway on Thursday (Surajdeep Singh)
- August 21st- Peel Police officer of 13 years charged with fraud after an 11-month probe into allegations of benefits fraud
- September 1st- Triple shooting in Brampton. 2 victims in life-threatening condition. First victim located Bovaird/Chinguacousy. Second victim near Hurontario/Steeles.
- September 1st- A 12-year-old boy was caught by Toronto Police and OPP after stealing his parents car and going for a joyride on the QEW overnight
- September 1st- Daylight robbery for car vehicle at knifepoint in Castlemore (Gardenbrooke Trail)
