

How does ASE Work?

- Mobile and Semi-Fixed options available
- Dual Radar capable of detecting up to five lanes in one direction
- First radar tracks the vehicles speed 195 times/second, second radar confirms the rate of speed and ID's vehicle

Is there a threshold speed? Yes.

- Threshold speeds are not public information
- Threshold speeds will mirror "traditional speed enforcement"
- ASE Cameras will be implemented in 60/50/40 km/hr zones and operate at different times during the day
- Community Safety Zones Fines will be doubled

Automated Speed Enforcement

Automated Speed Enforcement (ASE), an automated system that uses a camera and a speed measurement device to enforce speed limits, is a speed enforcement tool that uses technology to help make roads safer for all users.

ASE is designed to work in tandem with other road safety measures, such as traffic calming, community safety zones, speed display boards, education initiatives and police enforcement, to help improve safety for people of all ages by:

- increasing speed compliance
- altering driver behaviour
- increasing public awareness about the critical need to slow



Observations:

- 1. St. Marguerite d'Youville S.S. is located on the southeast corner of the intersection of Dixie Road and Father Tobin Road.
- 2. Posted speed limit on Dixie Road is reduced to 60 km/hr. when flashing lights are on in the vicinity of the school.
- 3. There are "No Stopping" restrictions posted on Dixie Road and Father Tobin Road in the vicinity of the school.
- 4. Two accesses lead to the school property: one for northbound traffic on Dixie Road and the other from Father Tobin Road.
- 5. The bus loading area is located along the west side of the school, parallel to Dixie Road. The Kiss and Ride zone is located along the south side of the school. Both are clearly identified with bright/fresh pavement markings.
- 6. Directional arrows and pedestrian walkways are clearly visible as drivers navigate around the school property to access both exits/entrances to school property.
- 7. No congestion occurred as buses and vehicles entered and exited school property. Drivers stopped and dropped off students everywhere other than designated areas.
- 8. No students were observed waiting at the public bus stop at the intersection of Dixie Road and Father Tobin Road.

Recommendations:

- 1. That the Site Inspection report be received; and
- 2. That the Principal be requested to continue to educate and encourage the drivers to use the designated Kiss and Ride area to drop off students and use the parking lot area to turn around when needed; and,
- 3. That the Brampton School Traffic Council revisit this school when the number of students attending school has returned to normal to capture a true sense of the interaction between all components at arrival and dismissal of the school.



Observations:

- 1. Kingswood Drive Public School has an enrollment of 548 students with approximately 292 students attending in person due to COVID-19. The school is served by three large buses and two small buses.
- 2. Signage indicating "No Stopping, 8:00 a.m. 5:00 p.m. Monday to Friday" are located on the east side of Kingswood Drive and on the west side in front of the school. On the west side of Kingswood Drive there are "No Parking" signs posted. Corner restrictions are in place at the entrance and exit of the driveway. Speed limit of 40kmh is posted on Kingswood Drive.
- 3. The bus lane and a drive through lane are identified with pavement markings, but there are no Kiss and Ride lanes. No conflicts were observed in the driveway.
- 4. Some conflicts were observed when buses exited the driveway as cars stopped in the corner restrictions or across the driveway to drop off students. Drivers also waited to see that their children cross the driveway to step on the sidewalk. It should be noted that there is a walkway approximately 4 meters south of the driveway exit, and a walkway north of the entrance that is further away.
- 5. Several vehicles stopped at or near the entrance and exit of the driveway. Vehicles also stopped or parked in front of the school on both sides of Kingswood Drive.
- 6. Several cars made U-turns and this caused congestion on Kingswood Drive.
- 7. A few cars also entered the driveway using the exit, which is clearly marked one-way.

Recommendations:

- 1. That the Site Inspection report be received; and
- That the Manager of Enforcement and By-law Services be requested to arrange to monitor and enforce the parking restrictions at Kingswood Public School during school arrival and dismissal times;
- 3. That the Principal be requested to:
 - Arrange for the placement of cones at the entrance and exit to prevent vehicles from entering school property at arrival and dismissal times;
 - Continue to educate and inform the student population on safety rules and responsibilities in and around the school.

Observations:

- Goldcrest Public school is located on the east side of Goldcrest Road. Currently only 50
 percent of the students are attending classes. The school is served by three large and three
 small buses.
- 2. Posted speed limit on Goldcrest Road is 40 km/hr in the vicinity of the school. "No Stopping" and "No Parking" restrictions are posted along the east side of Goldcrest Road in front of the school and "No Stopping, 8-5, Mon-Fri" are located on the west side of Goldcrest Road at the front of the school.
- 3. The school "Bus Loading" area is located on the school side of Goldcrest Road and extends from the walkway into the main entrance of the school to the exit of school property.
- 4. The one way entrance to school property is clearly marked to indentify the Bus Loading and Kiss and Ride areas.
- 5. A staff parking lot located on the north side of the school is coned off on mornings and after school.
- 6. Crossing guards are in place at the intersection of Goldcrest Road and Central Park Drive.
- 7. At arrival and dismissal times five members of staff, all wearing vests were outside assisting:
 - one at the exit/parking lot
 - two in the Kiss and Ride area
 - two in the Bus Loading area

- 8. The Bus Loading and Kiss and Ride areas worked very well during the morning. At dismissal time, a few cars did not follow the proper procedures in the Kiss and Ride area and had to be redirected by staff.
- 9. Cars parked in the restricted parking areas on Goldcrest Road in front of the school and this created a little congestion at the entrance to school property.

Recommendations:

- 1. That the Site Inspection report be received; and
- 2. That, in an effort to encourage Active Transportation to and from school, the Principal be requested to contact the designated Peel Health Nurse to participate in the School Travel Plan Program in Peel;
- That the Manager of Enforcement and By-law Services be requested to enforce the parking restrictions on Goldcrest Road in the vicinity of the school during arrival and dismissal times; and,
- 4. That the Principal continue to educate and encourage the student population and families to exercise safety in and around the school.


Observations:

- 1. The intersection of Valleyway Drive and Williams Parkway is a signalized intersection, highlighted with clear enhanced pavement markings on all legs of the intersection.
- 2. The following signage is posted on Williams Parkway:
 - Speed limit of 50 km/hr in the vicinity of St. Roch Catholic School
 - "No Stopping" restrictions on the north side on Williams Parkway
 - No "U-Turn" signage on William Parkway
- 3. The following signage is posted on Valleyway Drive:
 - "No Parking" restrictions along the north side leading up to the intersection
 - "Walking Route" and "Watch for Children" signage are in place on the south side
- 4. During the morning observation, four grade 7 boys crossed William Parkway safely without any issues. No students from Junior Kindergarten to grade 5 were observed crossing.
- 5. During the afternoon inspection, three children under grade 5 crossed Williams Parkway. They activated the push button, and had sufficient time to cross without any conflict.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. That the Site Inspection report be received; and
