WHY IS HERITAGE IMPORTANT?



- 1. Local heritage conservation creates a sense of place, identity and connection. It helps form community identity and a sense of belonging to a place.
- 2. A wealth of heritage attracts external wealth It attracts tourism, stimulates economic growth through investment and creates jobs.
- **3.** Heritage sites support and stimulate the local economy. It supports new jobs for contractors, architects, and artisans and positive and stable real estate prices.
- 4. Heritage preservation is a clear goal of the Provincial Policy Statement and the City's Official Plan. Heritage conservation is supported by policy initiatives at the federal, provincial and municipal levels.





Seven Ways heritage preservation contributes to livable cities and sustainable development:

- 2) Preserves Climate Responsive Buildings
- 3) Incubating Local Traditions & Values
- 4) Strengthens Community Inclusion & Intergenerational Equity

PROPERTY VALUES & HERITAGE



- Within a 20-year period, 2,700 individual properties that received designation under the Ontario Heritage Act had better sales, were able to resist downturns in the market, and increase or retain their value better than average property values
- Heritage districts are "unfailingly higher [in property values] than in comparable, non-designated parts of the city."¹
- It has been shown that preservation is critical to making urban places greener, more livable, and healthier².
- "Old buildings to a great extent contribute to the significance and identity of the urban fabric, and maintaining these buildings enhances the values of history, continuity, identity and smart growth, all elements that are essential for a sustainable economic development, not only for the core but also for the whole community and region as such."

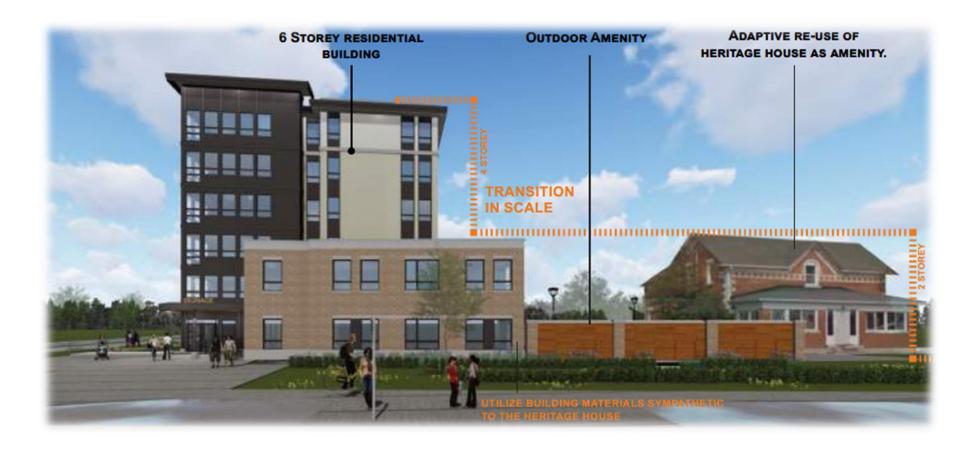

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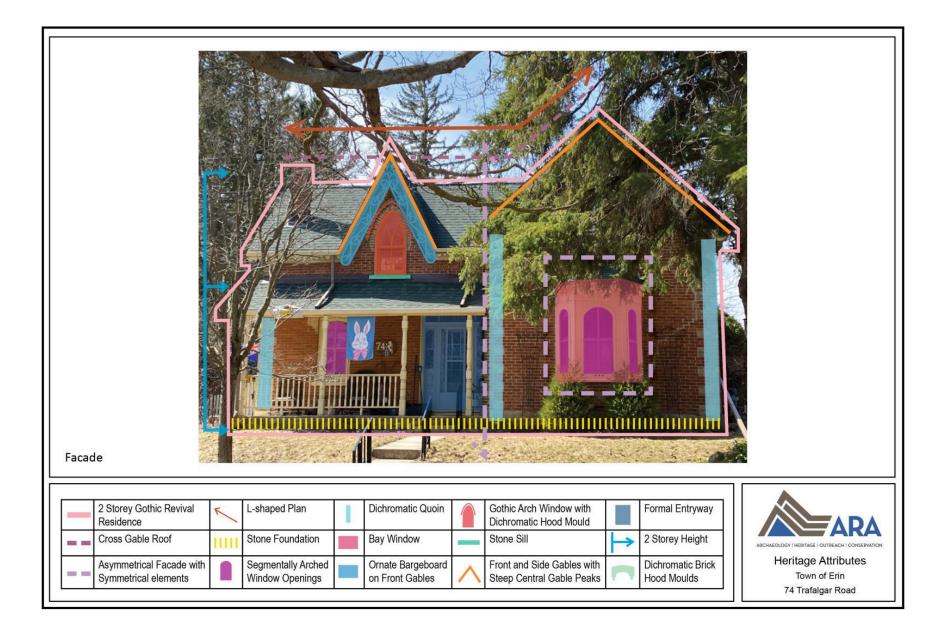






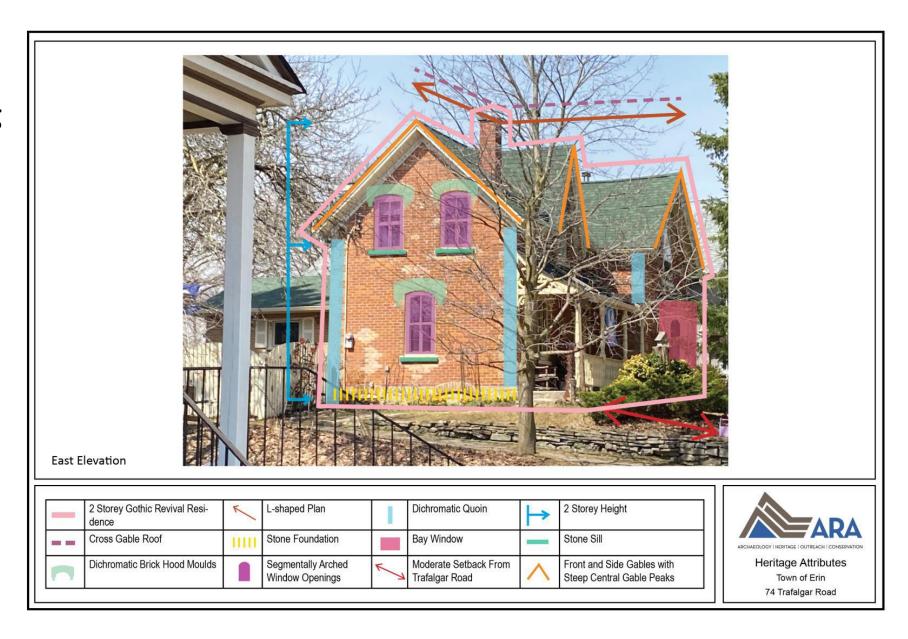


Anatomy of a Heritage Building

Ontario Regulation 9/06 CRITERIA FOR DETERMINING CULTURAL HERITAGE VALUE OR INTEREST

The property has design value or physical value because it,

- I. Is a rare, unique, representative or early example of a style, type, expression, material or construction method,
- II. Displays a high degree of craftsmanship or artistic merit, or
- III. Demonstrates a high degree of technical or scientific achievement.

The property has historical value or associative value because it,

- IV) Has direct associations with a theme, event, belief, person, activity, organization or institution that is significant to a community,
- V. Yields, or has the potential to yield, information that contributes to an understanding of a community or culture, or VI. Demonstrates or reflects the work or ideas of an architect, artist, builder, designer or theorist who is significant to a community.

The property has contextual value because it,

VII. Is important in defining, maintaining or supporting the character of an area, VIII. Is physically, functionally, visually or historically linked to its surroundings, or IX. Is a landmark.



Heritage Board Documents

Cultural Heritage Evaluation Report (CHER)

What is this Property? Does It Have Heritage Value? What are its heritage Values and Attributes?

Heritage Impact Assessment (HIA)

What is going to happen to the property? How will it affect the Heritage Value and can the impact be mitigated?

Heritage Building Protection Plan (HBPP)

What action do we need to take immediately to protect the building?

Heritage Conservation Plan (HCP)

What are the long-term strategies for the conservation of the property and its Heritage Attributes?

Documentation and Salvage Report (DSR)

Provides a complete record of the building and its history. Copy is sent to and kept by Public Library and PAMA

Commemoration Plan (COMP)

Lays out the details of how a property's history will be commemorated

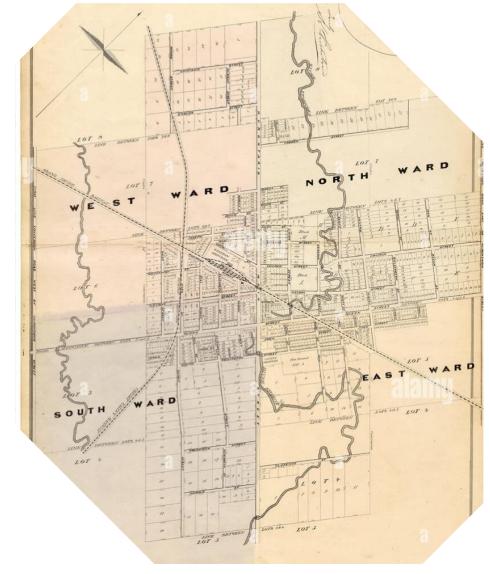
