

Accessible Parking Permits (APP)

A total of forty (40) investigations resulted in seizures of APP's in Q1. These investigations were either because the APP was expired, being misused or a fraudulent or reproduction of the APP.

Accessible Parking Permits (APP)

APP's are seized for a number of reasons / violations. The top reasons are;

- Misuse, family member or friend using permit without permit holder present
- Deceased, permit holder has passed away but relative/friend continues to use
 it
- Expired, permit is expired but actual permit holder continues to use it. If an expired permit is being used by non-permit holder it falls under "misuse"
- **Reproduction** / facsimile / copy of a genuine permit **or** fictitious permit that does not actually exist on Service Ontario system.
