SITE ALTERATION BY-LAW

Municipal Resourcing Scan

Staff undertook a jurisdictional scan of adjacent municipalities to understand the resources being allocated or already allocated to responding to new regulatory requirements for excess soil management. While the information received is limited, it is illustrative of expected municipal resource planning and allocation to address these new needs.

It should be noted that Brampton is ahead in terms of being ready to implement a comprehensive Site Alteration By-law that provides an end-to-end administrative framework for fill and excess soil management.

The table below summarizes the results of the municipal scan, with further detail following the table.
