#### Ontario Enhancing Tools to Help People Prepare for Respiratory Illness Season

- Starting in early October, flu shots will be available for the most vulnerable and highpriority populations, including hospitalized individuals, hospital staff, and residents and staff in long-term care homes, followed by those in retirement homes and other congregate settings and individuals 65 years and older.
- Free flu shots for the general public aged six months and older will be available starting October 28, 2024, at doctor and nurse practitioner offices, participating pharmacies, and some public health units.
- Beginning in October, families with infants and high-risk children up to 24 months old, will now have access to the new RSV immunization through the recently expanded publicly funded RSV prevention program.

Ontario is expected to receive shipments of the updated COVID-19 vaccine from the federal government by early October following approval by Health Canada. Initial doses will be prioritized for higher risk populations and more details will be provided once doses are distributed to Ontario.

#### **Ontario Government Invests in Faster Emergency Care**

- The provincial government is investing over **\$910M** to increase the availability of ambulances across the province and connect people to emergency care faster.
- Ontario is increasing land ambulance funding to municipalities by an average of 8%, bringing the province's total investment to over \$877M this year.
  - This increase in base funding will help municipalities address increased costs so they can continue to deliver high-quality emergency care.
- Ontario is also investing over \$33M through the Dedicated Offload Nurses Program to help hospitals hire more nurses and other eligible health professionals that are dedicated to offloading ambulance patients in hospital emergency departments.
- Additionally, Ontario is continuing to implement the Medical Priority Dispatch System (MPDS) across the province. The system helps prioritize and triage emergency medical calls to 9-1-1 so that paramedics can be dispatched sooner.

At this time, it is unclear how the announced funding will be distributed. The City of Brampton continues to advocate with the province for equitable health care funding for Brampton residents.
