
What do you think the average cost of prom is for students?



How It Works

Event Promotions

- Promotion letters and emails
- Flyer delivery to schools
- Press Releases sent out to media
- Social Media campaign begins
- Website updates and launch

Gather Donations

- Confirm volunteer drop-off locations and build the google map for the website
- Educate volunteers on procedure for sorting and tagging clothing
- Social media requests for donations
- Amazon Wishlist is refined

Student Registrations

- Registration is open to all students in Peel Region
- The website form is made available for students to register their time slot
- Walk-ins are accepted, and will be admitted as space permits

The Big Event



- Weeks preceding the event are spent organizing inventory to prepare for transport and finalizing event details (decorations, signage etc.)
- We rent a U-Haul on the day of the event to pick up from all of the drop-off locations
- 40-50 volunteers arrive at the event to create out incredible promwear pop-up shop (last year we had over 1300 pieces of clothing)
- Students register at the front door and then go shopping
- When they are finished, they check out their items (just like a store... but no money)



Building Partnerships within the Community

Building Partnerships

We collaborate with the social workers and guidance councilors at the Peel District School Board and the Peel Dufferin Catholic School Board to ensure that information about our event reaches as many students as possible, especially those students who really need us.

Raising Awareness

Through local charities and youth groups we raise awareness about the event, encouraging community involvement and participation from local stakeholders.





Volunteer Involvement

Ways that City Council Can Help



Transportation for Students



Peel Region is a huge area. And although we try to ensure our event is centrally located, some of our students are faced with close to a 2-hour journey on transit to attend the event. That's 4-hours both ways.



Hard to Find Donations



We had many students last year who couldn't find an outfit.

We have a lot of students who don't fit into commonly donated sizes.

We tried to get donations from local retailers, but were either turned away, or ignored.

Last year, Councilor Rod Power, from Brampton, agreed to purchase a suit for a young man who was much too tall to fit into any of our donated suits.

Raffle Prize Donations

Last year we had an anonymous donor purchase 5 Uber Black Gift cards for \$100 each so graduates could arrive in style at prom.

We also had gift cards for local retailers donated.

The students absolutely loved these prizes!
