### Ontario's Action Plan: Protecting People's Health and Our Economy

The \$186.1B Budget document predicts a \$33.1B deficit for 2021-2022 fiscal year, with projections of \$27.7B in 2022-2023 and \$20.2B in 2023-2044. The Province predicts deficits until 2029-30 fiscal year.

# **Peel Memorial Redevelopment**


- Peel Memorial Centre for Integrated Health and Wellness to become a new inpatient hospital with a 24/7 Emergency Department.
- The province will fund the construction of over 250 net new beds at the site.
- Providing up to \$18M in 2021-22 to expand the Urgent Care Centre to 24/7 operations, paving the way for an eventual emergency department as Peel Memorial expands into an inpatient hospital.
- The investments in Peel Memorial will allow the people of Brampton to have access to 24/7 hospital services including urgent care, complex continuing care, enhanced mental health, and rehabilitation for patients and their families.

# School of Medicine at Ryerson University in Brampton



The Province is providing Ryerson University with financial support in the planning for a proposal for a new institute of medical education in Brampton.

Planning for a medical school at Ryerson is led by the School of Medicine Planning Committee.

School of Medicine at Ryerson University will be designed around five (5)pillars:

- 1) Focusing on community centric primary care & social determinants of health
- 2) Providing culturally competent care to communities
- 3) Leveraging innovation and technology in practices to improve quality of care and patient outcomes
- 4) Providing future physicians with the skills to develop inter-professional networks of health care to achieve better outcomes for patients
- 5) Focusing on the aging and supporting seniors

# **Other Budget Measures** – Impact to Brampton

### **Education & Childcare**

• A new English public elementary school in Brampton will serve 850 students and include a Childcare Centre with seventy-three (73) licensed childcare spaces.

### **Community Paramedic Program for Long-Term Care**

 Committed \$160M over three years investment for thirty-three (33) communities participating in the program, including Region of Peel.

### Property Tax Reassessment

• Further one year postponement of the property tax reassessment. The Province will consult on reassessment in 2021 to consider COVID-19 impacts. The consultation will include municipal governments.

Significant provincial supports to the municipal sector earlier in the year:

- Extended funding through the **Safe Restart Agreement** until the end of 2021, with extensions to December 2022 granted on a case-by-case basis;
- \$500M in additional financial assistance for municipal operations, the City of Brampton received \$14,6M;
- \$500M in additional financial assistance funds for municipal transit operations, **Brampton Transit received \$15M**.

# **Provincial Government** Updates





**March 23, 2021**: Investing \$3.7M (part of the *2021 Budget*) to help seniors and people with disabilities get their COVID-19 vaccinations, where transportation is a barrier. The Province is launching this initiative to remove that barrier and ensure that anyone who wants a vaccine is able to get a vaccine.

**March 23, 2021**: Announced limited, targeted adjustments to public health and workplace safety measures in the Grey-Lockdown level of the COVID-19 Response Framework. This includes:

- Effective Monday, March 29, 2021 at 12:01 a.m., **permitting outdoor fitness classes, outdoor training** for team and individual sports and outdoor personal training, subject to public health and workplace safety measures, including, but not limited to: a maximum of 10 patrons;
- Effective Monday, April 12, 2021 at 12:01 a.m., personal care service settings including but not limited to barber shops, hair and nail salons, and body art establishments, will be permitted to operate at 25% capacity or five patrons (whichever is less) subject to physical distancing and other public health and workplace safety measures.

**March 25, 2021**: Introduced Bill C-25, the legislation will (when passed) provide an additional \$7.2B in support for urgent health care needs across the country, the COVID-19 vaccine roll-out, and for local infrastructure projects in our cities and communities. This includes:

- \$2.2B to address short-term infrastructure priorities in municipalities. The funds would flow through the federal Gas Tax Fund.
  - The federal government also proposes to rename the federal Gas Tax Fund as the Canada Community-Building Fund.

**March 23, 2021**: Announced \$23.7M for the Province of Ontario to operate a number of safe, voluntary isolation sites in various communities identified under Ontario's High Priority Community Strategy. These sites will help residents in the province who have COVID-19, or have been exposed to it, access safe isolation accommodations to keep themselves and their community safe.
