Please be advised that we are opposed to the Storm Water Pond location abutting Countryside

This site is the highest point of land in the area and would not be conducive to a gravity fed Storm Water Pond.

The proposed Storm pond beside Countryside Drive would be abutting the new homes to the west and the existing homes to the south. The location would create an invitation for people passing by and small children in the new development and area to investigate this new hazard pond with additional cost of liability insurance for Brampton.

Moving the Storm Water Pond immediately north to a land plateau shelf in the Valley would be good solution. The land is presently being farmed and can clearly be seen from the bridge on Airport Road or Google air photos attached. Appendix 4 with secondly plan designations clearly shows the proposed Storm Water Pond location includes valley land. The Storm water pond can be moved to the plateau shelf in the valley without any change to secondary plan designations.

Attached is an air photo of the Etobicoke Creek showing storm water ponds in the valley. The west side pond is in Brampton and the recent east side pond is in Caledon. More storm water ponds photos in valleys are shown on Google.

The developers proposed plan shows mixed commercial, town houses and apartments near the intersection of Torbram Road and Street "I" which would support supermarket plaza opposite, on the west side of Torbram Road.

Smart centres have property for Walmart (grocery) Superstore at the north east corner of Mayfield and Airport Road.

Our Country Trails plaza (harbour View Investments Ltd.) at the south west corner of Airport Road and Countryside Road has been struggling and the Sobeys grocery store has gone out of business and replaced.

With these additional grocery stores coming into the market area it is crucial that some apartments and townhouses replace the storm water pond, to give our Country Trails plaza some walk-in business to assure its survival.

It is essential that the storm water pond move into the valley. We need town houses and apartments (similar to what the developers are proposing for their development near Torbram Road and Street "I") to support Country Trails Plaza.

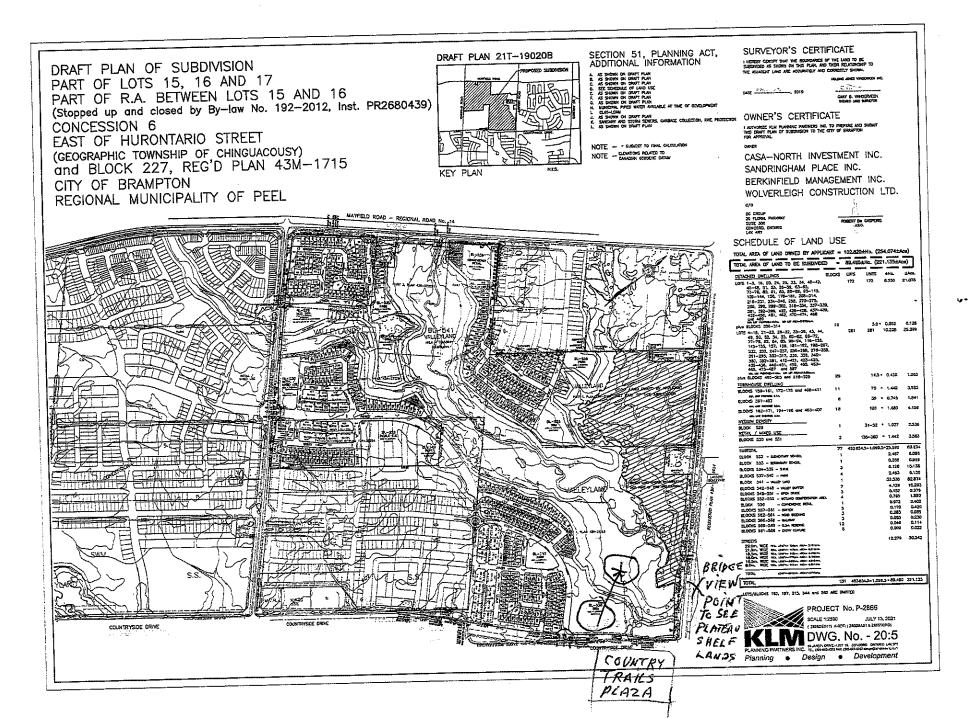
Moving the Storm Water Pond onto a shelf in the valley would be a win win solution for all.

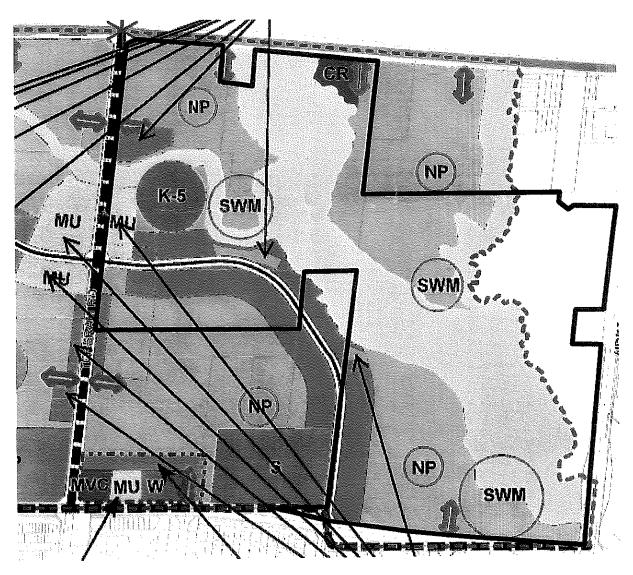

I hope this matter can be resolved without the costly expense and delays of an LPAT hearing for all parties involved.

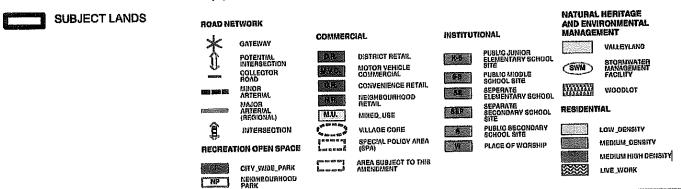

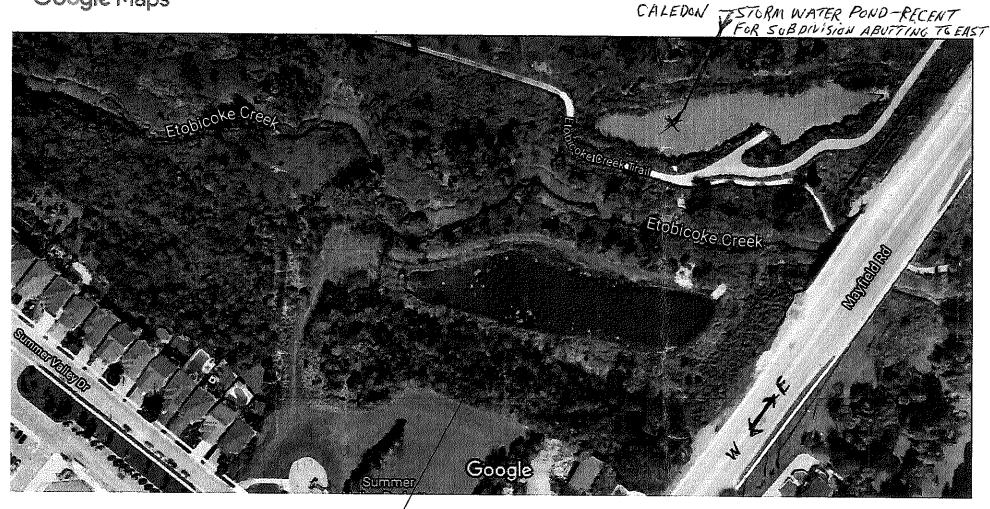
