


Program Results ** To-Date



ACCELERATED CYBERSECURITY TRAINING PROGRAM IMPACT

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Catalyst Corporate Training & Cyber Range Activities

In October 2021 Corporate Training & Cyber Range will launch a new suite of **ransomware-related products**. The products take a role-based approach to deliver training in a meaningful way to a variety of audience groups, such as Senior Leaders, Management, and Technical Teams.

Ransomware products feature interactive workshops and where appropriate, Catalyst experiential learning simulations (Tabletop Exercises and Cyber Range technical scenarios) to heighten engagement in the learning process, stimulate critical thinking and uncover key areas of improvement.

In Q2 + Q3, the Cyber Range has delivered:

•12 Demos to organizations within the public and private sector.

•8 Hands-on Cyber Range workshop sessions

•15 active proposals with clients from the public and private sector



Ongoing Training Activities

- Additional scenarios for the Cyber Range being developed with increased focus on incident response and recovery, and OT/critical infrastructure
