Hello Alex and city clerk,

With above file number, I got a public hearing notice for proposal of building houses at location of 9459 Gore road on West side of Gore road and North of Cottrelle Blvd.

This notice is not sufficient to provide required information about how the city and builders are proposing to develop the area. Lots of houses are already builded more than 10 years ago and now city and builder realize to develop the area is not acceptable. Almost all the streets, courts, blvds and all roads in this area is assumed by the city that shows there is not further room for development for additional housings.
