Bill C-21

- On February 16, 2021, Bill C-21 was introduced in the House of Commons.
- Proposed amendments to:
 - Criminal Code
 - Firearms Act
 - Nuclear Safety and Control Act, and
 - Immigration and Refugee Protection Act





Classes of Firearms

Non-restricted Firearms

Shotguns and rifles



Restricted Firearms

Predominantly handguns



Prohibited Firearms

 Certain handguns, fully automatic or converted automatic firearms, modified "sawed off" shotguns or rifles




Proposed changes of Bill C-21 apply to handguns



Firearms Licensing and Regulation

- Firearms regulated under:
 - Firearms Act, and
 - Part III of the Criminal Code of Canada
- Canadian Firearms Program (CFP) RCMP:
 - Firearms Licensing (individual) and Registration Certificate (firearm)
 - New and Renewed Registrations processed by RCMP
 - Issues reviewed by OPP and/or Municipal Firearms Officers





Firearms Licensing and Regulation

Possession and Acquisition Licence (PAL)

- Submit application to Central Processing Site (CPS)
- Issue licence if application is cleared
- Forward application to provincial Firearms Officer for further review if required
- If required, send application to Area
 Firearm Officers (e.g. OPP or PRP) for further investigation to determine applicant eligibility

Firearm Registration Certificate

- Individual seller / buyer can initiate the transfer over the phone
- Business can initiate the transfer via the Business Web Service portal
- Transfers are forwarded to the buyer's province for processing by Firearms Officers.
- Transfers of prohibited firearm are forwarded to the Canadian Firearms Registry (CFR) for verification and final approval.



Firearms Licensing and Regulation

Individual firearms licences by type in Canada and Ontario

| Jurisdiction | PAL | Minor's Licence | Total |

| Canada | 2,209,906 | 9,438 | 2,219,344 |
| Ontario | 624,939 | 3,775 | 628,714 |

Firearms registered to individuals or businesses by class in Canada and Ontario

| Jurisdiction | Restricted | Prohibited | Total |
|--------------|------------|------------|-----------|
| Canada | 1,057,418 | 178,496 | 1,235,914 |
| Ontario | 401,319 | 72,446 | 473,765 |

PAL: Possession and Acquisition Licence, issued 18 years and older



Proposed Amendments to Firearms Act

- Any municipality would have the ability to pass a by-law that:
 - Prohibits storage of a handgun at home;
 - Prohibits storage of a handgun anywhere within municipal boundaries;
 and
 - Restrict transportation of the firearm, with exceptions (e.g. amnesty programs)



Proposed Amendments to Firearms Act

Exceptions:

- Conditions would not apply to a handgun:
 - a) for training for a prescribed sporting competition;



- b) for which an individual holds an authorization to carry; or
- c) in the prescribed circumstances or for a prescribed purpose (yet to be defined).



Proposed Amendments to Firearms Act

- Compliance:
 - Licence holders be notified by Registrar of Firearms
 - 180 days to comply
- Non-compliance:
 - Maximum penalty of two years imprisonment
 - Revocation of a firearms licence or a registration certificate



Proposed Amendments to Criminal Code

- Increase maximum penalty from 10 to 14 years imprisonment for:
 - Possession of prohibited or restricted firearm with ammunition
 - Possession of weapon obtained by commission of offence
 - Firearm trafficking
 - Possession for purpose of firearm trafficking
 - Unauthorized import and export of firearms





Municipal Implications

- Enforcement:
 - Federal Regulation outside of Municipal By-law officer jurisdiction
- Impact:
 - Conditions apply to licensed firearm holders does not address illegal firearms
