COVID-19 vaccine bookings to open for all children aged five to 11 beginning on November 23

November 22, 2021: Children aged five to 11 will be eligible to book their appointment to receive the vaccine beginning Tuesday, November 23, 2021.

Appointments will be available through a variety of channels including the COVID-19 vaccination portal and contact centre, directly through public health units using their own booking system, participating pharmacies, and select primary care providers.

November 18, 2021: Enhancing COVID-19 testing by expanding the number of testing locations and making it more convenient to access publicly funded testing for those who need it.

November 18, 2021: Providing an additional \$500,000 in the Investing in Women's Futures Program, bringing the total funding to \$2.7 million this year.

23 women's centres across the province provide free employment readiness and violence prevention programming to socially and economically marginalized women.



November 19, 2021: Health Canada authorized the use of the Pfizer-BioNTech Comirnaty COVID-19 vaccine in children 5 to 11 years of age.

 Authorized a two-dose regimen of 10 micrograms to be administered three weeks apart, which is a lower dose than the 30 micrograms two-dose regimen authorized for people 12 years of age and older.

November 19, 2021: Effective November 30, 2021, fully vaccinated individuals with right of entry to Canada who depart and reenter the country within 72 hours of leaving Canada will not have to present a pre-entry molecular test.

- As of January 15, 2022, certain groups of travellers, who are currently exempt from entry requirements, will only be allowed to enter the country if they are fully vaccinated
- Starting November 30, vaccination will be required for travel within and out of Canada.
