7.1 Hospital Funding (For Information)

<u>Overview:</u>

- On November 11, 2021, Regional Council considered a motion requesting 50% contribution from the Region (\$62.5M) towards the City of Brampton's share ('local share') of the construction costs for the proposed new full-service Hospital in Brampton – the motion was referred to staff for a future report.
- The report indicates that no reserves are available for hospital funding without reducing the
 existing capital program or increasing the property tax staff provide analysis of potential levy
 impacts.
- The report indicates that any decision made on funding will likely set precedent for other requests to fund local Hospitals.

Staff Comments (Public Affairs):

- The report is accompanied by an environmental scan of Ontario municipal contributions to 'local share' with more recent examples (2021 – York & Durham) including contributions from upper and lower tier municipalities.
- The report also includes a draft AMO motion requesting Province to re-examine the local funding of provincial hospitals part of AMO's 2022 Pre-Budget Submission.
- Regional agenda includes delegations from Peel's three hospital systems.

15.1 Heritage Heights Secondary Plan Process Update

Overview:

 A summary of Regional staff's review of the Heritage Heights urban boulevard concept and secondary planning process.

Staff Comments (Planning):

- The report supports the Heritage Heights Secondary Plan, including the Urban Boulevard.
- Following Secondary Plan approval, City staff will continue to collaborate with Regional staff.
- Once there is greater clarity around Highway 413 post-provincial election, staff from the City and Region will be better positioned to bring forward recommendations to Council.
- City staff intend to bring forward the Heritage Heights Secondary Plan to the March 21st meeting of Planning and Development Committee to be considered by Council for formal approval.

Updates



March 4, 2022 Announced coverage for real-time continuous glucose monitors, the latest technology in diabetes care, through the province's *Assistive Devices Program*, making it more affordable for Ontarians living with type 1 diabetes to monitor their blood glucose levels.

Funding Opportunity:

- March 4, 2022 Announced doubling of *Seniors Community Grant Program* funding since 2018 by investing \$6M in 2022-23 for seniors-based projects that help Ontario's seniors.
 - Staff are reviewing the opportunity with applications due April 28, 2022.

March 4, 2022 Federal Government, Province and Mississauga announced funding to modernize public transit in Mississauga. Part of Mississauga's allocation through the Investing in Canada infrastructure Program - Public Transit Infrastructure Stream:

- Bus replacement program
- Construction of a new bus rapid transit (BRT) corridor along Dundas Street in Mississauga
- Transit priority measures for express bus corridors

March 4, 2022 Bill C-10 – An Act respecting certain measures related to COVID-19 received Royal Assent.
 The bill provides Health Canada with \$2.5B in funding and the statutory authority to purchase and distribute COVID-19 reprint tests across the country.
