President's Report: Grace Centre is holding an Open House on February 16 from 10:30-12 noon. This is a new Drop-In Centre for Seniors in the Brampton Area offering a variety of activities.

Speakers for National Home Share were absent

Speakers Bonnie Loranger RN CDE Diabetes Coordinator and Aruna Peri Registered Dietician MS CDE from Wellfort Community Health Services

Bonnie provided an overview of Wellfort Community Health Centre. The Centre is a not-for-profit value-based organization providing health services to individuals and families across the Region of Peel. Services include Primary Healthcare, Dental, Health Promotion and Educational Programs including Diabetes, HIV and Hepatitis C.

The Centre works with local residents and partner agencies to build community health.

Aruna indicated that they are Ministry Funded provide holistic care, receive approximately 150 to 200 referrals monthly from doctors and specialists

There are 4 Doctors and 4 Nurses on staff

All services are free of cost and some of services provided are:

Foot Care for diabetics- Chiropodist - assessment by Nurse first, fee charged if client able to pay Presentations to Community

Clients 18 + offered care - not children. Average age usually 50+ now seeing 20-30 years old Certified Diabetes Care given

Call Centre - 905-451-6959 or doctor referral or self-referral blood work required

Group Sessions - affords ability to accommodate (75-100 people) at the moment work with what the client needs and provide in-person service during COVID-19 pandemic

English, Hindi, Punjabi, Tamal, Polish and interpretative services

Myrna Adams helps with strategic needs by community

Group Zoom meetings can be arranged

Presentations on Coping with Stress with COVID-19

Meal Prep workshops well attended; diet stressed at first meeting, very welcoming, interactive Caregiver help for people with Dementia and Alzheimer's 2/3 years support Food program open to people also provide iPads, tablets

COVID-19 Cold and Flu clinic takes volume from hospital if COVID-19 support put in place COVID-19 in home - nurse attends. If hotel room needed -food provided and some financial aid Impact of COVID-19 on Diabetes? Outcome depends on how well the d-19iabetes is managed You must always be mindful when you have a chronic disease.

Foot Care not available to external paying clients, must have diabetes and be screened Dental Care provided for clients under 18, seniors and low -income individuals.

Rogers to move \$100 million dollar business from Dixie Rd. to downtown building 5,000 employees reduced to 3,000 They want a Zoning Order with permission to build mixed residential use on Dixie Rd. We need housing we do not have a signed lease in downtown Brampton, concerns re: their following through with the lease. To be downtown is good, affordable housing would be good

Roads - 6 main area roads. Ambassador Program - 6 positions - Work with businesses to revitalize the area more Business Friendly - launching soon.

Age Friendly roads one of many issues better engagement with Senior Council to get feedback. Must consult with Senior Groups not just Diversity groups.

Forbes recognized the City of Brampton as one of Canada's Best Employers in 2021, 58th out of 300.

Hospital Health Care advocating with the Province Provincial elections in June and Fall, Municipal elections in June

Rogers: HQ in Nova Scotia in future - cheaper housing and same pay.

Shoppers World - when will it start - breaking ground in Spring 2022. No exact timetable yet - starting on South Side of Shoppers World - not certain.

Health Care - \$20 Million in the bank. System very bad - Government gave \$1.1Billion - 25 beds and more for Cancer Treatment.

Use of Health Care - 167,000 through Emergency.

New Hospital finished in 2027 - Need Levy of \$50-\$80 per year.

\$30-35Milion for Cancer Care Treatment - looking for money from Region needs \$12.5Million.

Why is Urgent Care shut down? Not enough Doctors - Doctors and Nurses are getting sick.

A lot of inequities in allowing Doctors and Nurses from other countries to provide Medical Care in Canada.
