We do not journey alone. In our hospice, your family, friends and caregivers will be welcomed, supported, and cared for in their time of grief.




Brampton needs better end-of-life care.

THE GAP

There is an urgent need to better care for people dying in our community.

While most cities in Ontario have a hospice residence to support their community, the City of Brampton has none. As one of the fastest growing and most diverse communities in Canada with a growing senior population, this is a major concern.

The overwhelming majority of Canadians would prefer to die in a home-like setting. The reality is over 60% of people still die in hospitals, often without the peace, specialized care and support that they, and their loved ones deserve.



Kay Blair Hospice is currently in the process of raising the dollars needed to build and operate a state of the art twelve (12) bed hospice residence to serve the residents of Brampton and surrounding areas.

The Hospice will be designed to support individuals at the end of their lives in a compassionate homelike setting with exemplary medical care; spiritual care; psychosocial care and bereavement support.

Currently government funds only a small part of the capital needed to build the Hospice residence; KBH will need the support of the Brampton community to make this a reality.

"When my brother became ill at age 47 with stage four bladder cancer, my family turned to me to coordinate his care. I did not want my brother to die in a hospital setting that was noisy and uncomfortable for both him and the family staying by his bedside.

"My passion for building a hospice to provide inclusive and culturally-appropriate care stems from positive... and sadly, not-so-positive... health care experiences when my own sister was dying.

For cultural reasons and beliefs, my sister, Jaswinder, did not go to a hospice when she was end-of-life.

As we struggled with painful end-of-life decisions, Jaswinder was repeatedly


admitted to a local hospital. To my dying day, I will never forget how hospice staff from an adjacent hospice came to know of our pain and plight in the hospital. Our angels as we called them. Though not of the same culture or religion – they understood and respected our diverse practices of religious prayers, holistic care, extended family visits, and cultural food preferences. They also kept Jaswinder as comfortable and pain-free as possible.

The incredible care and compassion shown by the hospice staff, gave Jaswinder and us immense relief and some peace through a painfully traumatic time. This care and compassion continued when Jaswinder was discharged home, as per her wishes, to live out her last few days. Our family will remain forever thankful to the Southall Hospice, UK and its extraordinary staff."

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Definitions

Hospice Residence

A home-like residence providing end-of-life care for individuals in their last months and weeks of life

Hospice Palliative Care

is aimed at relieving suffering and improving the quality of life for persons who are living with, or dying from, advanced illness or are bereaved.

End-of-life Care

refers to health care for a person nearing the end of their life or in the advanced stage of a terminal illness.

Cultural Humility

Cultural humility is the "ability to maintain an interpersonal stance that is other-oriented in relation to aspects of cultural identity that are most important to the [person]."

Cultural Safety

An environment which is spiritually, socially, physically and emotionally safe, where there is no assault, challenge or denial of their identity, of who they are and what they need.
