8.4 Administering Affordable Housing Units Secured by Local Municipalities Through Inclusionary Zoning and Other Mechanisms (Recommendation)

Summary:

 This recommendation staff report seeks Council approval for the Region to take on an administrator role for affordable units secured by local municipalities via inclusionary zoning and other means through the development approvals process.

15.1 2022 Tax Capping Policy - Selection of Options (Recommendation)

Summary:

 Regional Council is required to pass a by-law each year to apply one or more of the optional tools under the Municipal Act, 2001 in calculating the amount of property taxes for properties in the (capped) property class.

Staff Comments (Finance):

- The Tax Capping report is an annual requirement, and staff endorse the continued application of all applicable optional tools/enhancements as a fair means of moving properties in the capped property class toward full Current Value Assessment (CVA) tax levels.
- The City will not have any properties in the capped property class for 2022 taxation, in line with the goal of adopting these capping options annually.

15.4 2021 Capital Performance and Impact on Capital Reserves and Reserve Funds – December 31, 2021 (Unaudited) (For Information)

Summary:

• Regional staff are required to report the status of operating and capital services minimum twice annually.

Staff Comments (Finance):

- The Region's 2021 year-end unspent capital is \$3.9B with annual spending of \$597.9M, equivalent to app. 6.5 years of work assuming similar annual spending pattern. In comparison, the City's unspent capital at the end of 2021 was \$1.0B with annual spending of \$187.0M, which is equivalent to 5.3 years of work again assuming similar annual spending pattern.
- In comparative terms, the amount of unspent capital in City's Capital program is in line, if not in a slightly better position compared to the Region.





May 5, 2022: Launches Request for Project Proposals for the Zero-Emission Vehicle Infrastructure Program


Expansion of zero-emission vehicle charging infrastructure and hydrogen refueling stations in public places, on-street, multi-unit residential buildings, workplaces and vehicle fleets.

- Maximum funding per type of infrastructure, up to a maximum of \$5M, per project.
- RFP will close on August 11, 2022.
