June 16, 2022: Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Finance outlined the federal Affordability Plan totaling \$8.9B in new support this year to help make life more affordable in light if the inflationary pressures driven by lasting impacts from the pandemic and external factors:

- Enhancing the Canada Workers Benefit
- Affordable Early Learning and Child Care
- 10% Increase to Old Age Security (OAS)
- Housing Affordability Payment
- Dental Care
- Benefits Indexed to Inflation


June 8, 2022: the Minister of Seniors, announced the launch of a new initiative called Age Well at Home.

- Budget 2021 provided \$90M in funding for Age Well at Home.
- Under the calls for proposals, organizations will be able to apply for funding for projects from two streams:
 - In-Home Support Pilot Projects
 - Scaling Up for Seniors.
- Application deadline is July 22, 2022.
