2. Create a more user-friendly means of accessing information about properties on the Municipal Heritage Register by updating the public facing information available through the City's website including Planning Viewer and Open Data.

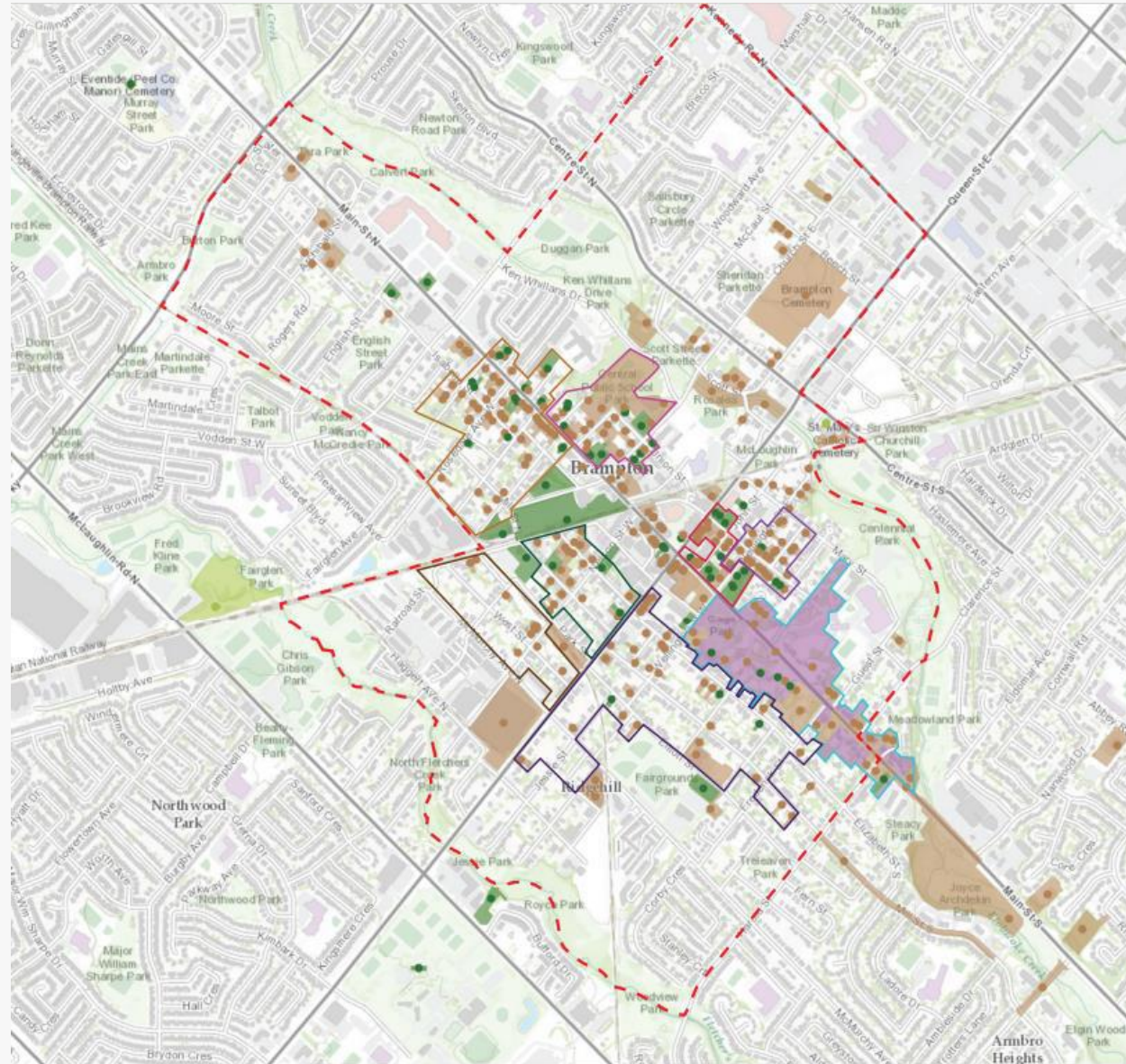
3. Provide staff with a standardized method for identifying and evaluating properties going forward.

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Current

3. Field Review- Develop and present a “Field Review and Recording Methodology. Establish short-, medium- and long-term priority areas
4. Property Evaluation- O. Reg 9/06
5. Recommendations- Removal, Addition, Updated Status.

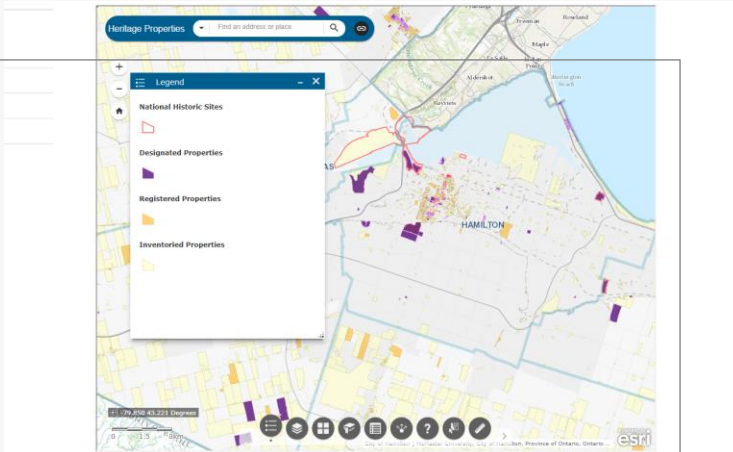

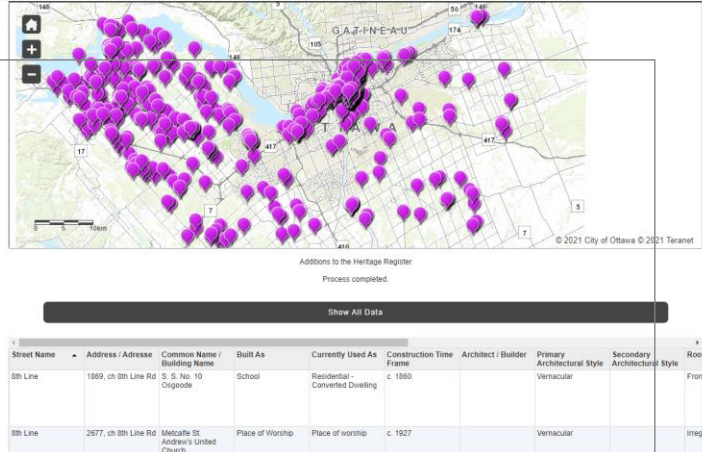

- The inventory work has been divided into neighbourhoods which is spearheaded by community led committees.

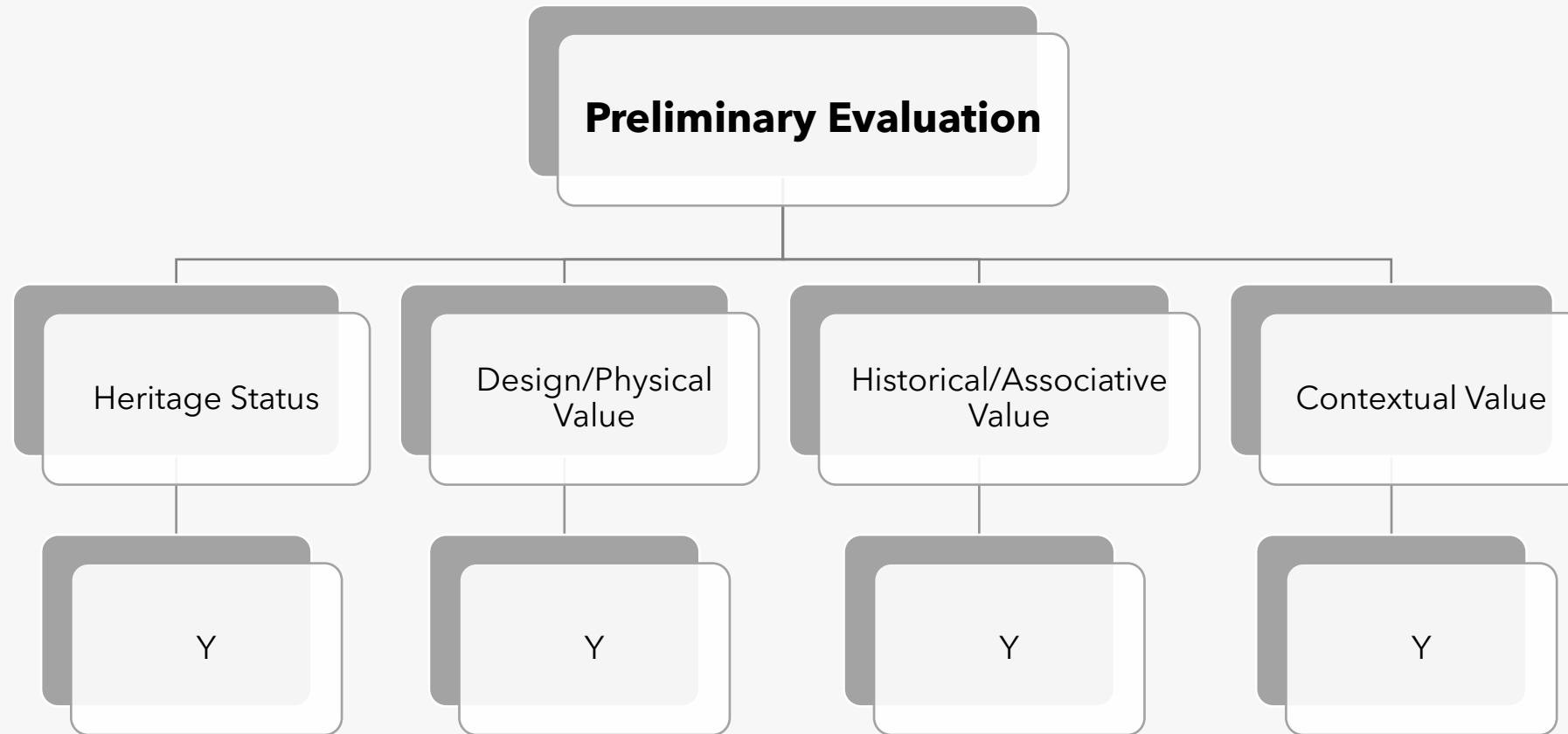
Updating

- Short-term, medium-term, long-term areas identified to carry out Built Heritage Inventory.

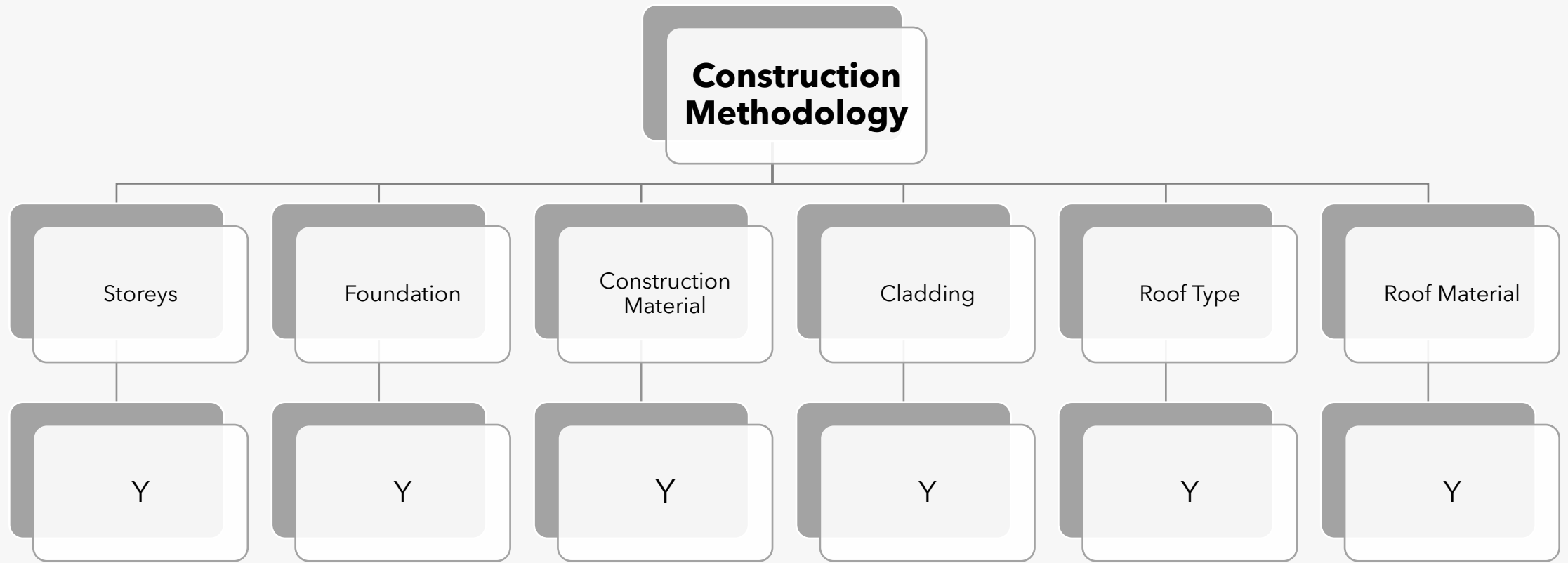

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Deliverables

1. An update to the register including GIS shape files with all relevant property information. This will be used to update/replace the heritage layers for the City's external mapping (Planning Viewer);
2. Complete review and update to property information on file for each listed or designated property;
3. Report of final recommendations and summary of findings for updates and next steps to maintain register;
4. Presentation to Brampton Heritage Board including summary of project findings, actions, and next steps;
5. Field review template that creates a review standard based on Ontario Regulation 9/06 for future surveys and updates;
