Evolving Community Safety in Brampton



2017 Preparing the Soil

- Work began in the Emergency Management Office to prepare for the new Police Services Act legislation
- Council established the Brampton Community Safety Advisory Committee (BCSAC)



2018-2019 Planting Seeds

- Involved in various emerging issues: alcohol in parks, cannabis, food security, gun-related matters, human trafficking, and missing persons
- Engaged with community through town hall and resident meetings
- Engaged with Brampton-serving organizations to initiate relationshipbuilding
- Council re-established BCSAC



2020 Focusing on Growth

- Response to COVID-19 Pandemic
- Term of Council focused priority to establish a Community Safety & Well-Being Office
- Term of Council focused priority to develop a Community Safety Action Plan



2021-2022 Nourishing

- Established Community Safety & Well-Being Office
- Merged Nurturing Neighbourhoods Program into Office
- Initiated staff resourcing
- Drafted Action Plan to be presented to Committee of Council for approval, in principle, June 22, 2022
- Open for community participation
- Maintain situational awareness of trends best practices, issues, and opportunities



2023+ Branching Out

- Socialize and operationalize Action Plan
- Maintain situational awareness of trends, best practices, issues, and opportunities

Area of Focus: Safety



What We Heard: Residents have expressed the need to have their safety concerns heard and actioned.

Intent: CSWO will work alongside residents to become aware of and address safety concerns.

Tactics:

- Annual Community Safety & Well-Being Office Survey (2023)
- Neighbourhood Chit Chat Opportunities (2023)
- Home and Property Crime Prevention Guide (2023)
- CPTED Audit Checklist and Street Walks (2024)
- Specialized Training (2024)
- Hoarding Coalition Support (2022)
- Referral Model Expansion (2023)

Outcomes:

- Residents gain access to municipal supports through CSWO
- Residents are equipped with tools and resources to address and overcome safety concerns
- Resources are in place to address acutely elevated risk

Goal: Residents are safer.

Highlights:

Action Plan tactics build on existing initiatives, projects, and programs, such as:

Peel Situation Table

- In December 2019, through referral of the BCSAC, Council approved the City of Brampton's participation in the Peel Situation Table.
- This tool allows staff to present cases where individuals, families, groups, or places are experiencing high likelihood of harm or victimization.

Missing Persons Protocol

 In 2018, through referral of the BCSAC, a communications procedure was developed to support the police response to missing persons, only when requested by Peel Regional Police.



Area of Focus: Awareness



What We Heard: Residents have expressed the need to know more about safety and well-being information and resources.

Intent: CSWO will work to create awareness of community information and resources.

Tactics:

- Online presence for Community Safety & Well-Being Office (2022)
- Community Safety & Well-Being Newsletter (2023)
- GeoHub Neighbourhood Profiles (2023)
- Community Safety & Well-Being Recognition Week (2024)
- Neighbourhood Association Guide (2023)
- Neighbourhood Association Guide (2023)

Outcomes:

- Residents are equipped with information and resources for supports related to community safety and wellbeing
- Residents are connected to community networks and service providers
- Residents gain additional tools and platforms to access municipal services

Goal: Residents are more connected.

Highlights:

Action Plan tactics build on existing initiatives, projects, and programs, such as:

Region of Peel Family and Intimate Partner Violence (FIPV) Campaign

 The City of Brampton participated in the FIPV Campaign since it was launched in 2020, supporting the planning and delivery of the campaign with the translation of materials, sharing of information within the community, and raising awareness of important issues such as genderbased violence and available supports and resources.

City of Brampton Spring into Safety Campaign

 Fire Life Safety, Transit and Community Safety staff launched a pedestrian safety campaign to raise awareness of individual measures to remain safe when on the road.



Area of Focus: Empowerment



What We Heard: Residents have expressed an interest in learning more about taking action within the community.

Intent: CSWO will work to empower residents and build capacity to take action towards enhancing safety and well-being in their neighbourhoods.

Tactics:

- Advance Brampton Fund: Community Safety Sub-Priority (2022)
- Community Safety Quadrant Coordinator (2022)
- Enabler for Community Projects (2022)
- Nurturing Neighbourhoods Program (2022)
- Focused Neighbourhood Development and Engagement (2022)
- Community-Wide Special Events + Public Education (2023)
- Community-Wide Garage Sale Weekend (2024)
- Friends of Community Safety & Well-Being Office (2023)
- Community Safety & Well-Being Office Volunteer Program (2024)

Outcomes:

- Residents gain access to municipal staff through CSWO
- Residents can take the lead in shaping the safety and well-being of their neighbourhoods
- Residents have increased opportunities to participate and connect within the community

Goal: Residents have an increased sense of belonging.

Highlights:

Action Plan tactics build on existing initiatives, projects, and programs, such as:

Enabler for Community Projects

 Throughout the years, staff has provided support and consultation to non-profit organizations, residents, and partners. In 2021, staff supported 11 initiatives and proposals.

Nurturing Neighbourhoods Program

- Through this program residents gain access to municipal supports and have opportunities to participate in a survey, online mapping tool, workshops, and community dialogue to help shape the safety and well-being of their neighbourhoods.
- Since 2019, 41 neighbourhoods have been toured with program partners and residents.


