From the beginning, BILD has been firm in our belief that constructive dialogue with the industry would be essential to offer the greatest chance of consensus on this important matter. In this regard, we would like to thank staff for their consultation practices with BILD, our consultants and our members. Further, BILD is pleased to see the inclusion of section 4(2) and 4(3), which we kindly requested, within the CBC By-law. Since these sections are included, BILD will not object to the CBC By-law nor encourage our members to do so. Furthermore, provided these sections remain in the CBC By-law and there are no other changes to the draft which are of concern to BILD, BILD will not appeal the CBC By-law nor encourage our members to do so. Please be aware, however, that BILD cannot prevent its members, on their own and for their own reasons, from opposing or appealing the CBC By-law.

As your community building partner, thank you for the opportunity to be involved in this process. We look forward to future engagement on important items such as this.
