I sincerely object to the city council's Banning of Election signs.

First. The signs are there for a purpose. They tell us who's running for what. Not everyone is politically aware and signs are the only way they know who's running. Are we then supposed to look for that information ourselves? Many people will not do that. Consequently to ban them will probably reduce the number of people who vote.
