As residents of Brampton, we take pride in the diversity of our community, both in terms of the people and the architecture. However, I am strongly opposed to the proposed development of two tall buildings at the intersection of Charlois and Main Street.

The sudden addition of these buildings would drastically change the character of the neighborhood and it would be a major safety and privacy concern for the nearby residents. These buildings would have over 400 units, which would cause significant traffic congestion and increase the likelihood of accidents.

I urge the Councillors, City Staff and the Developers, the Ivory Group, to acknowledge the concerns of the local community and to decrease the development to less than 8 stories.
