### **SECTION 1: TNRM PROGRAM OVERVIEW**

Trap, Neuter, Return, and Management is an effective management tool for the humane care and control of feral and/or displaced community cats. A best practices approach to the management of a feral cat colony will reduce the number of breeding cats through the spaying/neutering of the cats, re-homing and attrition. It will also ensure the health and welfare of the animals and reduce the number of nuisance cat conflicts and complaints.

The City of Mississauga (the "City") recognizes the important work of feral cat colony operators and supports their efforts in managing the feral cat population and optimizing the welfare of feral cats by allowing certain exemptions related to wildlife feeding for feral cat colony operators that are approved as Trap, Neuter, and Return Program Operators ("TNR Operator") under the Animal Care and Control By-law 0098-04. The City's Trap Neuter Return Management Program ("TNRM Program") provides support to approved TNR Operators in the area of veterinarian services, training, sheltering and adoption for feral cats as well as providing public education. Please note that in order to participate in the TNRM Program, approved TNR Operators must register for a TNRM Training Workshop offered by City of Mississauga Animal Services ("Animal Services") or have completed a workshop similar to that provided through the Toronto Cat Coalition.

# **SECTION 2: TRAP NEUTER RETURN MANAGEMENT PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY**

In order to qualify for the exemption under the By-law and be eligible to participate in the TNRM Program, the Applicant must:

- Submit a completed application to the City's Manager of Animal Services or their designate (any incomplete applications will not be processed);
- Be approved as a TNR Operator by the City's Manager of Animal Services or their designate, in accordance with the requirements of the By-law;
- Agree to the terms and conditions for TNR Operators, as set out in this Application; and
- Complete the TNRM Training Workshop in order to participate in the City's TNRM Program.

The City's Manager of Animal Services or designate will review your application and provide confirmation to you in writing that the Applicant has been approved as a TNR Operator in accordance with the By-law.

Once you have completed the required TNRM Training Workshop, the City's Manager of Animal Services or designate will confirm to you in writing that the Applicant has been approved to participate in the TNRM Program.

## **SECTION 7: TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

In consideration of applying for and being approved as a TNR Operator in accordance with the Animal Care and Control By-law 0098-04 ("By-law") by the Manager of Animal Services and participating in the City's TNRM Program, the Applicant acknowledges and agrees to the following:

- 1. To operate a feral cat colony located in the City of Mississauga.
- 2. To register with Animal Services as a TNR Operator.
- To register for a TNRM Training Workshop offered by Animal Services or have completed a workshop similar to that provided through the Toronto Cat Coalition.
- 4. To keep accurate records of the feral colony cats including the number of cats, descriptions of each individual cat and any details relating to health, behaviour, veterinary care, transfers and arrival of new cats and to provide documentation/information upon request of Animal Services.
- To notify Animal Services of any stray or domestic cats that may come to the colony as due diligence to reunite lost pets with their owners.
- To work cooperatively and transparently with Animal Services and regulatory agencies as TNRM colonies may be subject to inspection on a random or complaint basis.
- 7. To follow TNRM Guidelines, as outlined by Animal Services and attached to this Application.

- 8. To actively promote pet adoptions through an established web site, pet adoption outlets in the community or through Animal Services.
- 9. To spay and or neuter, rabies vaccinate and ear-tip all cats prior to adoption
- 10. To promote responsible pet ownership including pet licensing, compliance with by-laws and legislation and animal welfare to all potential adoption clients when applicable.
- 11. To screen potential adoption clients or foster volunteers to ensure the welfare of the pet(s) and successful placement of the animal(s) when applicable.
- 12. To allow Animal Services to conduct an initial inspection upon submission of this application form to ensure the standards of care required by the By-law are met.
- 13. To provide Animal Services with reasonable access to the premises where the feral cat colony has been established in order to conduct an unscheduled inspection and/or on a complaint basis, to ensure that applicable standards of care and Guidelines are being complied with.

- 14. The Manager of Animal Services has the ability to request further information or supporting documentation before approving the Applicant as a TNR Operator and may disqualify a TNR Operator at any time for any reason if the Applicant does not comply with the By-law, Guidelines or the Terms and Conditions contained herein.
- 15. Animal Services will only be responsible for fees related to the sterilization, vaccination and ear tipping of approved feral colony cats. Any veterinary care required or fees resulting from unrelated health issues will remain the sole responsibility of the TNR Operator.
- 16. The Applicant shall indemnify and hold harmless the City and their respective representatives against all liability, loss, costs, claims, damages, and expenses causes of action, actions, claims, demands, lawsuits and other proceedings, by whomever made, sustained, brought or prosecuted, including third party bodily injury, death,

- personal injury, and property damage, in any way based upon, occasioned by or attributable to the Applicant's approval as a TNR Operator under the By-law and Applicant's participation in the City's TNRM Program.
- 17. It is recommended that the Applicant carry necessary and appropriate insurance that a prudent person carrying on as a TNR Operator would maintain, to cover the potential liabilities of the Applicant arising in connection with participation in the City's TNRM Program, in particular, the liabilities under Section 16 (the Applicant's indemnity). The Applicant acknowledges and agrees that no protection will be afforded to the Applicant by the City for any claims arising in connection with the Applicant's participation in the City's TNRM Program
- 18. The City reserves the right to cancel, suspend or alter the TNRM Program at any time.
