Andrew Charles, Supervisor, Planning, Brampton Transit, provided an update on Brampton Transit, highlighting the following:

- Transit Capital Improvements
  - Stops & Shelters
- Information & Covid-19
  - EnAbling Change
  - Impacts to Brampton Transit

Committee discussion included following

- Overcrowding in buses and challenges staff are experiencing to address the issues resulting from the pandemic, such as, absenteeism and lack of staff of resources
- Indication that some Transit terminals already offer bathroom amenities and new Transit hubs are being designed to include such

#### amenities

- Ridership during the pandemic advised that government grants have assisted to offset loss of revenues
- Details on Transit plans to hire and train new employees
- Accessibility seating capacity have not been an issue
- Details on the percentages of accessible bus stops, budget and timeframe for making all bus stops accessible
- Suggestion that sidewalks should be a requirement in industrial areas
- Requirements for accessible stops follow AODA guidelines and staff work with other Transit agencies to ensure consistency with requirements
