# Proposal to Mitigate displaced garbage in the City of Brampton by Accountability

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#### Identifying the problem:

- The growth of the city population has increased 39% since 2012
- While this is positive occurrence for business and job placement, it is also one of the highest contributing factors to displaced garbage. More people = More garbage

• Brampton **Community** streets, **Business** and private properties, and **Public** green spaces are riddled with displaced garbage
