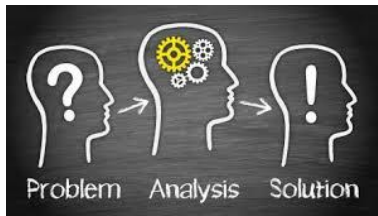

Proposal to Mitigate displaced garbage in the City of Brampton by Accountability

Identifying the problem:

- The growth of the city population has increased 39% since 2012
- While this is positive occurrence for business and job placement, it is also one of the highest contributing factors to displaced garbage. More people = More garbage

Solutions 1 – The Communities

Knowledge/Education</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Provide Labels of pictures of what goes where on their bins Encourage the use of Garbage 'apps' QR code guiding to Brampton bylaws Notice to renters and Home owners outlining their duty to keep the property and city clean <p>2. Enforcement of Bylaws – City to be proactive</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Zero, 1st & 2nd time offenders given a warning Property standards team follows up with frequently reported properties via 311 Summer students go door to door and report, with proof of images and uploaded to 311 <p>3. Financial Impact</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 3rd time + offenders fined for bylaw delinquency – funds are to be used to support Public / Green Space initiatives



Solutions 2 – Business Areas

	Cause/Problem in	Effect/Analysis	Solution(s)
2	<p>Businesses Areas</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Overspilling patron garbage bins rarely emptied• Parking lots ie grocery lots riddled veggie bags & disposable cups/food containers/cigarette butts• Business garbage bins at the rear overspilling due to the business improper handling or illegal dumping• The use of plastic veggie bags as grocery bags as they are free• Secondhand donation bins overflowing	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Garbage ends up on other private / public properties and greenspace fields, trees and waterways• Discourages people to shop in the city	<p>1. Knowledge/Education</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Mall/Business health and safety rules• Mall/Business/ Building owners responsibilities• Brampton as a city bylaws <p>2. Enforcement of Bylaws – City to be proactive</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Property standards team proactively drive around to see delinquents• Property standards team follows up with frequently reported properties via 311 <p>3. Financial Impact</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Fines for bylaw delinquency, fines are hefty – funds are to be used to support Public / Green Space initiatives





Solutions 3 – Public Spaces

	Cause/Problem in	Effect/Analysis	Solution(s)
3	<p>Public / Green Spaces</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Illegal Dumping• Park adoption and lack of ownership• Disrespect for public spaces• Public events increase traffic	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Green spaces riddled with garbage• Overflowing bins going to neighboring areas or rummaged through by wild animals causing the city extra work of cleanup	<p>1. Knowledge/Education</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• QR Codes on bins for people to scan and report via 311 when a bin is excessively full• Labels of pictures what goes where / QR code Brampton Bylaws• Put 'Litter Picker Grabbers' in park areas (with anti-theft enablement) to encourage people to clean up <p>2. Enforcement of Bylaws – City to be proactive</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• City to be ready when events are hosted of proximity bins to event also require emptying• Property standards team follows up with host of public events that they are abiding by cleanup bylaws• Property standards team looks at adopted areas <p>3. Financial Impact</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• City to add extra bins in well used areas such as bus shelters that are considered 'hubs' or 'more frequently visited due to population or two cities 'connect'• Increase pickup of frequently visited areas• Fines for bylaw delinquency of Park Adopters / illegal dumping / hosted events
