### 5.1 2022 Deloitte Audit Results Report (For Information)

### **Summary**:

• In accordance with Canadian Generally Accepted Auditing Standards and relevant ethical requirements, including those pertaining to independence, the audit of the 2022 Consolidated Financial Statements for the Region of Peel and Peel Housing Corporation by the Region Auditor, Deloitte is complete.

#### Staff Comments (Finance):

- Deloitte issuing an unqualified audit opinion, which means that the consolidated financial statements present fairly the financial position and comply with PSAB municipal financial reporting requirements.
- There are no uncorrected misstatements identified for both Region of Peel and Peel Housing Corporation during the 2022 audit, with exception for a correction identified and completed in 2022.
- There are no significant internal control deficiencies identified for both Region of Peel and Peel Housing Corporation, and the auditors provided two recommendations in relation to internal control matters.

### **Summary**:

• The 2022 Audited Consolidated Financial Statements for the Region of Peel, Peel Housing Corporation and Region of Peel Trust Funds reflect the financial position as at December 31, 2022 and the results of operations for the year.

### **Staff Comments (Finance):**

- The consolidated financial statements for the 2022 fiscal year have been prepared in compliance with the requirements
  of the Public Sector Accounting Board (PSAB) of the Chartered Professional Accountants of Canada as required by the
  Province of Ontario. The consolidated financial statements are presented to the Audit Committee for review and
  approval, which are part of the key statutory functions of the Audit Committee.
- The consolidated financial statements provide information on financial position including the value of assets and liabilities, cost of delivering the Region's municipal services and investment in capital projects, financing sources and investing activities.

- While the Province has passed Bill 112 (Peel Dissolution), the staff report points out that the advocacy priorities regarding Peel services remain important to Peel residents and businesses and it is essential that these services continue to meet the needs of the community, now and in the future.
- Staff will continue to work together to maximize opportunism for joint advocacy and to advance priority initiatives.

### **Summer Recess**

Thursday June 8, 2023 was the last sitting day before the summer recess.

- Lt.-Gov. Elizabeth Dowdeswell granted royal assent to Bill 112, Hazel McCallion Act (Peel Dissolution).
- During hearings at the Standing Committee on Heritage, Infrastructure and Cultural Policy, the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing indicated that the Ministry is in talks with regional governments about strong mayor powers and "facilitating the streamlining of development at the regional level".

As a result of a government motion the House will reconvene on Monday, September 25, 2023, two weeks later than originally scheduled allowing MPPs to attend the International Plowing Match.

# Provincial & Territorial Ministers Responsible for Local Government met in Ottawa

- Reaffirmed their commitment to supporting local governments, collaborating on shared priorities, and building strong and vibrant communities.
- Topics of discussion included local governance, planning for climate change adaptation and associated local infrastructure, and increasing housing supply as well as local services to support growth.
- The Federal Minister of Housing and Diversity and Inclusion also attended the meeting, which reaffirmed shared Principles Underlying Federal Government Initiatives Regarding Municipalities include reinforcing the importance of predictable federal infrastructure funding.
