Canada Walks

A division of Green Communities Canada that promotes the value of walking and walkability.

- Walkability is measured with regard to six main parameters, which are:
- A great walking experience. routes are pleasant and inviting.
- Safety separation from vehicles, good lighting, adequate snow and ice clearing, etc.
- Accessibility routes are designed for all users, including those with mobility challenges.
- Connections complete network to allow easy access to desired destinations.
- Comfort communities are developed so that desirable destinations are within walking distance.
- Walkable Destinations walkers have shade, shelter and places to sit.

Green Communities Canada suggestions. On a municipal level.

- Sign the International Charter for Walking.
- Adopt a walking strategy and walk friendly development approvals.
- Hire a pedestrian planner.
- Establish an advisory committee.

Walk Friendly Ontario

A past recognition program from Green Communities Canada

- This program existed between 2013 and 2015 as a recognition program that encouraged municipalities to create and improve spaces and places to walk by awarding Bronze, Silver, Gold and Platinum designations.
