This is our Kiss and Ride area that circles through the staff parking lot. Although we encourage families to use the Kiss and Ride to drop off students, many park their cars and walk or send their children unsupervised across the parking lot to the school. On different occasions, many of our staff's cars have been damaged with parents parking or pulling over to drop students off.



This is parents pulling up to the kiss and ride. Some parents pass cars that are letting off students and could lead to students being injured. We have 3 teachers that supervise the kiss and ride areas. One close to the parking lot that encourage cars to move up to let students off and 2 other teachers that help students out of the cars.

The street that our school is located on (Fernforest Drive) is a busy street and cars are usually parked on both sides of the street letting students off. This congestion would be lessened if more parents used kiss and ride.

Student, community and staff are at the forefront of us wanting to reassess our Kiss and Ride areas and safety protocols. What we would really like is to make the Kiss and Ride area safer for our staff, students and families. Although we encourage our families to use it, they would rather park in the driveway in front of the school thus blocking the regular bus as well as our 3 special needs buses from coming in and blocking lanes for cars that are driving through. We are also fearful for the safety of our students that are exiting the bus and walking to school with all of the traffic and cars parked illegally. We also have parents parking in the parking lot putting students' safety at risk as well. We would like a reassessment of our kiss and ride area to explore other options that make our school parking lot and driveway a safe space for our students, families and staff.
