THE ISSUE

- ■Youth in the community a safe place to stay
- ■Vulnerable youth transitioning out of CAS care.
- Risk of human trafficking
- •Increased risk of homelessness.





THE ISSUE

- The total number of individuals experiencing homelessness in Peel Region was **866** in 2021, of which **16%** were youth aged 16-24.
- The majority of homeless youth in Peel Region stayed in emergency shelters (37%) or transitional housing (16%) in 2021
- The average cost of rent for a one-bedroom apartment in Peel Region was \$1,484/month in 2022, which is higher than the income assistance for a single individual with no dependents (\$733/month).



KEY POINTS

- Vulnerable Transition Period During this transition, youth often encounter significant challenges. It's a period of uncertainty and vulnerability that demands our attention and support.
- Preventing Human Trafficking Human trafficking is a real threat to our youth. Providing a shelter can be a proactive step in preventing them from falling prey to this crime.
- Reducing Youth Homelessness The impact of homelessness on young lives is profound. By addressing this issue, we aim to break the cycle and offer a brighter future.
- Holistic Support –Need for comprehensive services. Holistic support is essential. It encompasses not only shelter but also counseling, education, and life skills—providing youth with the tools they need to succeed.
