ROAD RESURFACING:

The resurgence of a street and a neighbourhood can be greatly improved with Road resurfacing/ New Curbs and new sidewalks.

You will observe when roads are resurfaced, private residences on the road are inspired to resurface their own driveway, invest in plants and trees, and upkeep to their home. A little resurgence emerges.

This chain reaction comes from the newly resurfaced road which suddenly improves the look, feel, desirability and pride of a street & neighbourhood.

One of the fundamentals in rejuvenation of a neighbourhood comes from the roads and sidewalks themselves: How they look, how they feel, how they function, if they feel safe and are beautiful. The good interaction with a neighbour on the road etc.

In an effort to bring about a resurgence on streets and neighbourhoods in Brampton, I'm asking the City to invest significantly in Road resurfacing in the 2024 Budget.

Last year the city invested 15 Million to Road resurfacing. If the city worked to double that in 2024 it will allow a greater number of streets to be resurfaced. We can get roads from the 2025 program on the list for 2024 and expedite them. It's been a hard few years and we need residents to fall in love with their street again.

If you commit to this then I will be able to correspond with the roads department on street suggestions that need new Road resurfacing/ curbs/ sidewalks, for the sake of rejuvenating a neighbourhood.

Thank you for investing into speed bumps and safety measures and these should be kept when a road is resurfaced.

Attached are photos of many current roads. The last two are of Mill St S and Hilldale Cres both recently resurfaced. They look beautiful and the neighbourhood suddenly look so much nicer. The desirability and pride of the streets have risen and it allows for young families and others who look at buying a property to find confidence in that beautiful street. Then these young families fix up their homes and a resurging neighbourhood emerges.
