# Ontario Receives Report to Support Financial Sustainability of Postsecondary Education System



- The provincial government created the blue-ribbon panel of experts to provide advice and recommendations for keeping the postsecondary education sector financially stable and focused on providing the best student experience possible.
- Over the past few months, the panel conducted research and consultations with key stakeholders. Their work was guided by the following principles:
  - Enhancing student experience and access,
  - Rewarding excellence and financial sustainability,
  - Improving labour market alignment,
  - Promoting economic growth and prosperity, and
  - o Keeping education affordable for lower and middle-income families.

# Housing Minister Calandra Introduces the *Planning Statute Law Amendment Act*, 2023

- Last month the provincial government announced a reversal of certain decisions related to official plans and official plan amendments.
- The Planning Statute Law Amendment Act, 2023, if passed, would reverse provincial changes
  made in November 2022 and April 2023 to official plans and official plan amendments in 12
  municipalities: the cities of Barrie, Belleville, Guelph, Hamilton, Ottawa, and Peterborough,
  Wellington County, and the regional municipalities of Halton, Niagara, Peel, Waterloo, and York.
- Through the province's review of the official plans, a limited number of changes are proposed to be maintained under the legislation.
  - o These instances include changes the province made to protect the Greenbelt, protect public health and safety, and align with existing provincial legislation and regulations.
- Recognizing that in some cases more than a year has passed since the plans were first approved, the affected municipalities have been given until December 7, 2023, to submit information.

#### Ontario Introducing Legislation to Manage Real Estate

- The Ontario government introduced legislation, that, if passed, would support priorities that people in Ontario need – like building more housing units, including affordable housing and long-term care.
- The proposed *Improving Real Estate Management Act, 2023*, is part of the government's. plan to manage real estate more efficiently at the provincial level, improve economic growth, and save taxpayers' money
- The proposed legislation would remove and/or modify an organization's realty authority in whole, through full centralization, or in part, through a tailored approach.



### The Governments of Canada and Ontario sign bilateral agreement to end gender-based violence

- The federal government will be investing \$162 million over four years to support the implementation of the National Action Plan to End Gender-based Violence in Ontario.
- This plan contains targeted, coordinated strategies designed to prevent gender-based violence while supporting community-led solutions.
- The Plan is focused on three priority areas:
  - 1. Increasing prevention efforts,
  - Reaching underserved and at-risk populations, and
  - 3. Stabilizing the GBV sector.
- This agreement will help the Government of Ontario strengthen the sector supporting survivors and people at risk of gender-based violence through enhancements to existing programs and services.
