Armagh is the **only** second-stage, transitional housing facility in the Peel **Region** for women and children who have fled Gender Based Violence. Currently, Armagh serves over **1.5 million** residents with only 31 units. On average, we turn away 40 applicants per available unit.

FAMILY & INTIMATE PARTNER VIOLENCE IN THE PEEL REGION

The Sobering Statistics:

- The number of women in the Peel Region who have used counselling services to deal with violence increased by 51%
- 2 in 5 people murdered in the Peel Region were killed in domestic violence incidents
- The number of women who have requested transitional and housing support increased by 65%

HOUSING AND POVERTY CRISIS IN THE PEEL REGION

- 26.9% increase in shelter use for households/persons without permanent housing
- 75% of women reported abuse and conflict with a partner, spouse or parent as their top reason for housing lost
- 1 3-year long waitlist for Victim of Family Violence Special Priority Unit depending on family size and unit location
- 175,980 people live in poverty because of limited access to supports and resources



Art therapy is offered every week at Armagh. This creative program supports children and youth who have witnessed and/or experienced domestic violence, which in turn will help break the cycle of abuse for future generations.





ARMAGH'S MILESTONE PROGRAMMING

Armagh provides wrap around, holistic, trauma informed support to all clients through the aid of **case workers, child and youth workers, career counselors, therapists**, and more.

Clients collaborate with Armagh's program team to curate an individualized plan of care and action that identifies their goals. Armagh's mission is to empower women through:

- Education
- Employment
- Breaking the cycle of violence through individual therapy and support groups
- Parenting and child support, art therapy, support groups and counseling for children and youth

Women connect with their support team on a weekly basis to ensure that the milestones outlined in the action plan are being met. As a result, Armagh has supported over **35 families** in the past year alone to **complete educational programs**, **enter the workforce**, **and begin living independent lives**, **free from violence**.




